8:00 p.m.- Victoria Varney, massage therapy applicant:

Ms. Varney came in to apply for a massage therapy license. She is currently working in the Newton and Wenham and is in the process of applying to work at the Andrea Dobay Salon, located here in Sudbury in Mill Village at 365 Boston Post Road. Ms. Varney submitted a complete application and from a motion made by Dr. Geitz, that was approved by Dr. Kern was granted a massage license to practice here in the Town of Sudbury.

BOH Fees- The Health Director talked about increasing certain BOH feesspecifically focusing on tank replacement fees that are currently \$25.00. Dr. Kern suggested that we create a 3rd. category for an upgrade of a system; therefore the fee schedule would read:

- (1) New= \$600.00
- (2) Expansion= \$300.00
- (3) Repair/Replacement= \$25.00

The Health Director also talked about the non-payment in June 2002 to the Parmenter contract. It has been decided through working with the accounting department that a payment of \$3,585.25 will be made to Parmenter with what is left of the tobacco control money. A motion to pay Parmenter their past-due amount was granted.

West Nile Virus- The Health Director spoke about the numerous calls that the office has been receiving about this virus and the reporting of dead birds. Since two birds have already tested positive from the Town of Sudbury there is no need at this time to test any more birds although residents have been asked to call the state lab at the MDPH to report birds since that department is the one logging information into their database.

Frost Farm- The on-going controversy affecting Frost Farm due to septic issues was discussed. The Health Director discussed recent developments including contacting the manufacturer's engineer and the design engineer about trying to treat the odor problem by adding a filter bed so that the vent is pushed further away from residencies. The developer is not resisting any changes or repairs that are deemed necessary to correct the odor problems.
