Present: Vice Chairman Maryann K. Clark and Selectman Kirsten D. Roopenian.

The statutory requirements as to notice having been met, the emergency meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Maryann Clark at 4:00 p.m. in the Loring Parsonage, 288 Old Sudbury Road.

**Utility Petition 98-6, Moore Road Conduit**

Consideration of Utility Petition 98-6 of Boston Edison Co. and Bell Atlantic-New England, for location of conduit in Moore Road, had been last tabled on September 14, 1998, with the understanding it would be voted upon as soon as possible after, but not until, agreement had been reached concerning the tree replacement issue between the neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Plati, and Christopher Mutti, Doe Builders.

The Board was in receipt of a Release and Settlement Agreement between the parties, which stipulated the Selectmen act on this utility petition by five o'clock this day. It was therefore, on motion, unanimously

VOTED: To grant utility petition 98-6 of Boston Edison Co. and Bell Atlantic-New England for permission to construct, and a location for, a line of conduits and manholes, with the necessary wires and cables therein, under the surface of Moore Road, northwesterly, approximately 190 feet southwest of White Oak Lane, a distance of about 32 feet, off Pole 192/5, as shown on Boston Edison "Plan of: MOORE ROAD, SUDBURY Showing PROPOSED CONDUIT LOCATION", dated July 16, 1998, and N.E.T.&T. Co. Plan No. 98-06, dated July 30, 1998.

**Bonfire Permit – LSRHS**

In accordance with a request dated November 13, 1998, from Nancy Ponn of Lincoln, it was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To grant permission for a Pre-Thanksgiving Day Ceremonial Bonfire at the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School on November 25, 1998, from 6:00-9:00 p.m., subject to approval by the Regional School District, the Police Department and the Fire Department.

**Middlesex Conservation District Grant Application**

The Board was in receipt of a draft grant proposal the Middlesex Conservation District is submitting to the State Commission for Conservation of Soil, Water & Related Resources and a request for support from Sudbury's Selectmen. The grant would be used to conduct a series of phosphorus control workshops for Assabet and Sudbury River watershed communities to help communities and businesses understand and meet anticipated regulations to reduce phosphorus discharge into these rivers.

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To issue a letter of strong support for the Middlesex Conservation District's grant application for the purpose of conducting phosphorus control workshops for the Assabet and Sudbury River watershed communities; and to express the Board's appreciation to the District for these much needed efforts.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 4:20 p.m.
