**Bond Anticipation Notes**

Finance Director Maureen Valente was in attendance with the completed Bond Anticipation Notes for the Board of Selectmen signatures.

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To approve and sign Bond Anticipation Notes in the amount of \$8.1 million at the low bid rate of 3.099% for the purpose of obtaining funding for the Weisblatt and the Meachen-Meggs properties.

**Sudbury Earth Week and Cleanup Day**

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To declare the week of April 25 to May 1, 1999 as Sudbury Earth Week and to declare May 1, 1999 as Spring Cleanup Day.

**Council on Aging Donations**

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To accept \$63.95 in miscellaneous donations for deposit into the Council on Aging Van Donation Account; and to authorize the Council on Aging to expend the same for purposes of operating and maintaining the Council on Aging vans.

**Minutes**

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To approve the minutes of the regular and executive sessions of March 22, 1999.

**Town Meeting Article Review**

Selectmen Roopenian asked to revisit and re-vote positions on Article 36 (Senior Residential Community, Minimum Open Space), Article 37 (Incentive Senior Development, Minimum Open Space), and Article 47 (Lighting in Residential Districts).

After a short discussion and clarification with regard to residential lighting, it was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To support Articles 36 and 37 as submitted and to readdress Article 47 at the next meeting.
