Hunters Run	From Meachen Road to a dead end, a distance of 466 +/- feet;
A portion of Hampshire Street	From the end of the public way of Hampshire Street to a dead end, a distance of 140 +/- feet;
Plantation Circle	From Old Lancaster Road to a dead end, a distance of 799 +/- feet;
Camperdown Lane	From the end of the public way of Camperdown Lane to a dead end, a distance of 985 +/- feet;
Abbottswood:	From Camperdown Lane to Country Village Lane, a distance of 2,170 +/- feet;

Michael Lane:	From Widow Rite's Lane to Cudworth Lane, a distance of 255 +/- feet;
Cudworth Lane:	From Briant Drive to a dead end, a distance of 2,137 +/- feet;
Briant Drive:	From Willis Road to a dead end, a distance of 1,486 +/- feet;
