

Sudbury Dept. The Board of Selectmen moved, and seconded to approve the request of the Sudbury Inn for permission to extend beverage service from 12:00 midnight Saturday, December 19, 1964, to 1:00 a.m. Sunday, December 20, 1964. The vote was unanimously opposed to grant this request. The Selectmen may not grant an extension of beverage service to a Sunday.

8. School Budget Case

The Board of Selectmen moved, seconded and unanimously voted to authorize Mr. Henry Hardy to appeal the decision of Justice Thomasello in the School Budget Case to the Supreme Judicial Court.

9. Decision of Boston Edison Hearing

It was noted by the Selectmen that the decision on the hearing of the Boston Edison overhead tension lines was in favor of Boston Edison Company granting rights of easements to Sudbury, Wayland and Concord. Discussion on this case was deferred to the meeting of December 17, 1964, when Town Counsel Alan M. Winsor and Philip Buzzell, attorney for the three towns, would be in attendance.
