

IN BOARD OF SELECTMEN  
TUESDAY, APRIL 7, 1992

Present: Chairman David A. Wallace and Judith A. Cope; Selectman-elect Lawrence L. Blacker; Selectman Drobinski arrived just prior to the opening of Town Meeting.

The statutory requirements as to notice having been met, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Wallace at 7:15 p.m. in the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School Library.

Town Meeting


Executive Secretary Richard E. Thompson distributed to the Board the new handouts requested at the Monday Annual Town Meeting session concerning the Personnel Classification Plan and the detailed budget breakdown sheets.

Melone Property

The Executive Secretary also distributed to the Board a communication from Health Director Robert Leupold concerning the Melone property soil testing. The Executive Secretary informed the Board that earlier in the evening he had discussed the same with Selectman Drobinski who had stated that, subject to review of Mr. Leupold's letter, he would recommend that the Board proceed with the Melone purchase. Mr. Thompson also informed the Board that Selectman Drobinski had reviewed the latest Unisys data and was satisfied that the Unisys contamination appears to be migrating away from the Melone property and on that basis also he would recommend that we proceed with the Melone purchase. There was continued discussion between the Selectmen and Selectman-elect Blacker relative to Selectman Cope's concerns that 1) the future mining operation may affect the migration of water flow, and 2) that she desired a more affirmative statement from Woodard & Curran on this subject other than their handwritten response of March 20, 1992.

Shortly thereafter, while the Selectmen proceeded to the Town Meeting stage, Selectman Drobinski appeared and, in discussion with Selectman Cope and Mr. Blacker, confirmed the statements reported by Mr. Thompson and there was a consensus of the Board to proceed with the Melone purchase subject to Selectman Drobinski's final review of Mr. Leupold's letter. [Note: The next day, Selectman Drobinski called Mr. Thompson and informed him that he was satisfied with setting a date for closing on the Melone purchase; Mr. Thompson so informed Town Counsel to begin the process.]

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
