

IN BOARD OF SELECTMEN
JUNE 18, 1973

Present: Chairman William F. Toomey, John C. Powers, and John E. Taft

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The statutory requirements as to notice having been complied with, the regular meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman William F. Toomey.

Massachusetts Bicentennial Commission

The Board received a communication dated June 6, 1973, from the Massachusetts Bicentennial Commission relative to a meeting with the Cities and Town Coordinator, Mary Herbert, and directed the Executive Secretary to contact the Coordinator to arrange for said meeting.

Sudbury/Concord Mutual Aid Firefighting Agreement

The Executive Secretary reported that, following the Selectmen's meeting of June 4, 1973, he had been in telephone contact with Mr. Flynn, Town Manager of Concord, indicating the Board's consensus at that meeting that the terms of Concord's communication, dated April 17, 1973, were unacceptable.

The Executive Secretary also reported that the Sudbury Finance Committee, following a review of the above-mentioned communication, indicated that Sudbury should negotiate for the best possible offer, and proposed a Concord per capita formula discount of 40-50 percent, based on the 1970 signed agreement.

The Executive Secretary recommended that a counter offer be made to Concord, and stated that in his opinion, an increase in Concord's per capita cost discount to 40% was reasonable.

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To authorize and direct the Executive Secretary to contact the Town of Concord to indicate Sudbury's willingness to join into a contract at 60% of the previous per capita formula agreement, in the amount of approximately \$18,240, which would further amend the original Concord/Sudbury Firefighting Service Agreement, dated August 11, 1970, as amended January 11, 1971.

Minutes

The Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the regular meeting and the executive session of June 11, 1973; the former as amended.

Appointments

Chairman Toomey announced the following appointments made by the Selectmen:

Earth Removal Board - Carmen Pinto and John McKenna, for terms to expire 4/30/75.

Public Weigher - Alfred F. Bonazzoli, for term to expire 4/30/74.

Application for Incorporation

Following a review by the Selectmen of the below-named application for incorporation, it was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To send a favorable report to the Secretary of the Commonwealth on the application of Lawrence L. Blacker, 15 Country Village Lane, and Alan Reed, 50 Stubtoe Lane, for incorporation of the Boston Cluster for Clinical Pastoral Education, Inc., to be located in the City of Boston.

Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School - Signs

Present: Mrs. R. J. Hodder and W. James Hodder

The Board received a communication, dated June 13, 1973, from the Assistant Principal at the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School, in response to the Board's letter of June 5, 1973, relative to the signs taken during Senior Week. The letter assured the Board that the Regional administrators had cooperated to the best of their ability in making sure that the signs left at the school had been returned to their rightful owners, and that they had, in some instances, used school personnel and materials to help restore and replace the signs.

The Board was also shown a letter from Assistant Principal Frank Heyes, Jr. to Mrs. R. J. Hodder, owner of Twillingate Gardens. The letter returned a bill which she had sent to the High School to cover replacement of her business sign, with the explanation that there were no funds available in the school budget for payment of such a bill.

Chairman Toomey stated that the Board would meet in executive session with the Regional School Committee and the school administrators on July 5th, and that the subject of the stolen signs would be on the agenda for that meeting. Chairman Toomey further stated that the matter of reimbursement to Mrs. Hodder would be pursued by the Executive Secretary.

July Fourth Parade

The Board received a letter from the Park and Recreation Commission, requesting that the Board of Selectmen act as Parade Marshals in the July Fourth Parade. Chairman Toomey directed the Executive Secretary to contact the Park and Recreation Commission, stating that they were in accord.

Sudbury, Suffolk, England - Presentation

Chairman Toomey announced that Selectman Taft will make a presentation on his recent trip to Sudbury, Suffolk, England, at the Town Fathers' Forum on June 25th.

Selectman Taft announced that he would especially like to invite other Sudbury citizens who have visited Sudbury, Suffolk, to attend and participate.

Justice of the Peace

After review and upon recommendation of the Chief of Police, it was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To send a favorable report to the Governor of the Commonwealth that the Selectmen represent that Mr. George W. Gibson, a Justice of the Peace residing at 34 Wagon Wheel Road, Sudbury, is, to our personal knowledge, of high character and standing and suitable in all respects to be designated and commissioned to solemnize marriages under the provisions of Chapter 207, Section 39, of the General Laws.

Treasury Warrant

The Board signed a bills payable warrant in the amount of \$97,287.68.

Heritage Park Work Day

The Executive Secretary announced that one of the Heritage Park Work Days held this date had been very successful, and that with the help of approximately thirty-five Mormon Elders, a large area had been cleared.

Selectmen's Meeting - June 25, 1973

The Executive Secretary announced that the June 25th Selectmen's meeting would begin at 7:00 p.m. rather than the regular hour of 7:30 p.m.

It was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To enter into executive session for the purpose of discussing, deliberating or voting on a matter, which, if made public, might adversely affect the reputation of any person.
