Minutes

It was on motion by Selectman Robert J. Hotch unanimously

VOTED: To approve the minutes of the regular session of March 28, 1979, as amended and the minutes of the regular sessions of April 2 and April 3, 1979, as drafted.

Temporary License - First Parish Church

Following a brief discussion it was on motion by Selectman John E. Murray unanimously

VOTED: To grant a Temporary License for the Sale of Wines and Malt Beverages Only, to be drunk on the premises, to Dorothy Wadman, Chairman, Music Committee, First Parish Church, to accommodate an operetta fund-raising event; said license to be exercised on May 3, 4 and 5, 1979, during the hours of 8:00 - 12:00 P.M. in the Annex Building of the First Parish Church, Old Sudbury and Concord Roads, with the understanding that the issuing of this license for three days will not set a precedent for future requests, and that the subject of granting temporary alcoholic beverages permits will be reviewed in the near future.

Tax Caps

The Executive Secretary brought to the attention of the Board, House Bill #5915, which amended House Bill #5909, relative to tax caps, and requested the Board's support to notify our local representative of its strong opposition to Section 13A in the House Bill #5915, which in essence would not allow towns, cities or districts which levy property taxes to reduce said taxes for the next succeeding fiscal year by applying free cash available at the close of the previous fiscal year.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 7:30 P.M.
