

IN BOARD OF SELECTMEN
WEDNESDAY, APRIL 9, 1980

The statutory requirements as to notice having been fulfilled, the meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman John E. Murray, in the library of the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School.

Communications

Executive Secretary Richard E. Thompson brought to the Board's attention the following communications:

- 1) dated April 9, 1980, to both Alden Pearlstein and Gerald Teplitzky, from the Selectmen's office, confirming the rescheduling of the dog complaint hearing - Pearlstein/Teplitzky - from April 9 to April 22 at 8:00 p.m. in the lower Town Hall and requesting Mr. Pearlstein restrain his dog(s) until the completion of the hearing. (This communication was hand delivered to both parties by the Dog Officer earlier today.)
- 2) dated April 9, 1980, to Mr. Nick Pappargeris of 42 Village Road from Building Inspector Joseph E. Scammon relative to certain violations of the Town's Zoning Bylaws at 42 Village Road.
- 3) a notice of Public Hearing, to be held May 1, at 8:00 p.m. in the Loring Parsonage, dated April 7, 1980, sent to abutters of Shadow Oak Farms by the Earth Removal Board relative to earth removal at said location by S. F. Doyle & Company, Inc.
- 4) dated April 3, 1980, to Coatings Engineering Corporation from the State Water Resources Commission, Division of Water Pollution Control relative to a preliminary Engineering Report.
- 5) a memorandum dated April 8, 1980, from R. N. Foster of the State Executive Office of Environmental Affairs, relative to a hearing of Longfellow Glen, Sudbury, (which Mr. Thompson stated was the Sudbury Non-Profit Housing Corporation project off Route 20), to be held Friday, April 25, at 10:30 a.m. in the Town Hall.

Article 13 - Street Acceptances

Executive Secretary Richard E. Thompson informed the Board that Article 13 - Street Acceptances - had been held (taken off the consent calendar) by Mrs. Charlotte Goss, that her concerns have been addressed, and that she withdrew her hold.
