The statutory requirements as to notice having been complied with, the special meeting was called to order by Chairman Cossart at 6:30 p.m. in the Loring Parsonage.

Municipal Bonds - Curtis and Noyes School Roofs, 1982 ATM Articles 30 and 31

Following a brief explanation by the Town Treasurer, it was on motion unanimously

VOTED: To confirm approval of the bid award made on July 13, 1982, by the Town Treasurer for the sale of the Bonds of the Town dated July 15, 1982, \$430,000 Municipal Purpose Loan of 1982 Within Debt Limit (Nos. 1 to 86) payable July 15, \$90,000 in 1983 and \$85,000 in 1984 to 1987, to Bache Halsey Stuart Shields Inc., at 100.06999 and accrued interest; and it was further

VOTED: To sign 1) a Signature and No Litigation Certificate and 2) a No Arbitrage Certificate and 3) an Authorization of Facsimile Signatures for said bonds.

Middlesex County Extension Service

Town Facilities

Chairman Cossart reported that he had met with School Committee Chairman Adrienne Powell to discuss the possibility of the local School Committee voting to excess Nixon School and use Loring School for administrative purposes, and Chairman Powell had been firm in the need of retaining the Nixon School for school department use.

There was agreement by the Board of Selectmen that the Selectmen must coordinate and prepare an overall plan addressing the future use of all town/school buildings in order to have an acceptable presentation at a town meeting.
