

IN BOARD OF SELECTMEN
THURSDAY, OCTOBER 7, 1982

Present: Chairman William J. Cossart, John E. Murray and Anne W. Donald.

The statutory requirements as to notice having been fulfilled, the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. in the library of the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School by Chairman Cossart.

Sudbury Variety

Executive Secretary Richard E. Thompson referenced a Summons and Order of Notice on Application for Preliminary Injunction from the Superior Court, Civil Action #82-5168, Richard J. Rogers d/b/a Sudbury Variety v. William J. Cossart et als. Town Counsel was requested to appear on the Board's behalf tomorrow at 9:30 a.m., Superior Court, Cambridge.

Article 10 - LSRS Roof

Mr. Thompson informed the Board that the new figure for Article 10 - Lincoln-Sudbury Regional School roof is \$39,925.71, which is Sudbury's share.

Juvenile Restitution Program

Chairman Cossart reported a recent conversation with Juvenile Probation Officer Bonner Clifford concerning Sudbury's Juvenile Restitution Program and that Mr. Clifford is anxious to meet with the whole Board to re-discuss the issue and establish new policies and procedures. Chairman Cossart further reported that Mr. Clifford discussed the matter with an open mind, especially as it relates to expanding our program to include juveniles who commit offenses on private property.

The Board directed Mr. Thompson to contact Mr. Clifford and set up a mutual meeting date, preferably at a Board's regularly scheduled meeting, and to invite Juvenile Safety Officer William B. Carroll and the Juvenile Restitution Committee members.

Positions on Articles

Present: Town Treasurer Chester Hamilton; and Finance Committee Members, Thomas G. Dignan, Jr., Marjorie Wallace, Bettie H. Crawford, Bernard J. Hennessy, David A. Wallace, Chairman James A. Pitts, William D. Wood (arrived late), Lindalee A. Lawrence and William H. Maurhoff.

Chairman Cossart brought to the attention of the Finance Committee the fact that the Selectmen had taken new positions on the monied articles in view of the new information received from the Assessors earlier this week on the FY83 assessed valuation figure. That figure came in lower than anticipated - the total of \$478,201,827 being approximately a 1% increase.

Before he went into the recommendations of the appropriations, Chairman Cossart stated that it was the Board's unanimous position to put as much money as possible into the stabilization fund, and the Finance Committee's consensus was desired on that issue.

Selectman Cossart presented the Selectmen's new positions on the monied articles and asked the FinCom to consider the same.

Later in the evening it was reported back to the Board that the Finance Committee did support the Board's recommendations, specifically Article 12- Stabilization Fund, with the exception that, if the Fire Chief made a motion to reinstate funds for the North Fire Station under Article 7 - Budget Adjustment, they would support the same.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
