

IN BOARD OF SELECTMEN
MONDAY, OCTOBER 3, 1983

Present: Chairman John E. Murray, Anne W. Donald and Myron J. Fox.

The statutory requirements as to notice having been fulfilled, the meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by Chairman Murray in the Library of the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School.

Dance/Temporary License - Loring School Building

In accordance with a request received from Nancy P. Doran, Vice President, New England Home for Little Wanderers, and approval from Susan M. Weiss, Sudbury Community Arts Center, Inc., dated September 29, 1983, it was on motion by Chairman Murray unanimously

VOTED: To authorize the use of the Loring School until Midnight, November 19, 1983, for a dance to be held as a fundraiser by the New England Home for Little Wanderers;

and it was further

VOTED: To grant a Temporary License for the Sale of Wines and Malt Beverages Only, to be Drunk on the Premises, to Nancy Doran, representing the New England Home for Little Wanderers, to be served on November 19, 1983, from 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight, at the Loring School/Sudbury Community Arts Center, Woodside Road, during their fundraising dance, subject to Police Paid Detail.

Town Counsel Paul L. Kenny stated that the Loring School, under lease to the Sudbury Community Arts Center, is no longer considered Town property but should be treated as any other privately-owned property in a residential area in terms of zoning and other Town regulations being met, in this case, for extension of hours from those listed in the lease, and for a temporary serving license.

Tax Rate

Present: Town Treasurer Chester Hamilton.

Responding to question by the Town Treasurer relative to the setting of the tax rate, Chairman Murray stated that it might be necessary for the Assessors to send out estimated bills, which would take about five to six weeks.

Mr. Hamilton expressed concern that if tax bills were not sent out by November 1 it would be necessary for him to renew the current borrowing of Three Million Dollars and borrow Five Hundred Thousand Dollars more.

Executive Secretary Richard E. Thompson stated that right now it is important to determine whether or not it would be any faster to send out estimated bills or not, but stated that the tax bills would not be out by November 1.

Motions, Special Town Meeting

Chairman Murray stated he would make the motion for Article 1, Unpaid Bills, and the Selectmen agreed that he would do all the motions.

128 WRRRC

Selectman Donald gave Mr. Thompson some material she had received relative to the 128 West Resource Recovery Council under date of September 29, 1983, and asked him to file it.

Executive Session

At 7:25 p.m. it was on motion by roll call

VOTED: To enter into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing litigation; where open discussion of the same would have a detrimental effect.

(Roll call vote: Chairman Murray, in favor; Selectman Donald, in favor; Selectman Fox, in favor.)

Chairman Murray announced that Public Session would not reconvene following the Executive Session.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50 p.m.
