

IN BOARD OF SELECTMEN
MONDAY, APRIL 6, 1987

Present: Chairman Anne W. Donald and David A. Wallace.

The statutory requirements as to notice having been fulfilled, the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Library of the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School.

Excess Municipal Land

On the recommendation of Executive Secretary Richard E. Thompson, it was on motion of David A. Wallace unanimously

VOTED: That the following parcels of land, now under the control of the Board of Selectmen, are no longer needed for municipal purposes:

- 1) a portion of the land adjacent to the Fairbank School, containing approximately five to six acres and being a portion of the land shown as Parcel 001 on Assessor's Map F06;
- 2) a portion of the land adjacent to the Massachusetts Firefighting Academy, containing approximately one to two acres and being a portion of the land shown as Parcel 036 on Assessor's Map K06;
- 3) the land on Willis Lake Drive, shown as Parcel 140 on Town Property Map F05 and containing .11 acres according to said map.

Parcels 1) and 2) are described in Articles 28 and 29 and the maps following thereafter in the official Warrant for the Town of Sudbury 1987 Annual Town Meeting, to which reference is hereby made for a more particular description of said parcels.

Annual Town Meeting

Positions were formulated by the Board on the following 1987 Annual and Special Town Meeting Articles:

- Article 10, Landfill Upgrading - support amount estimated to be the cost as DEQE has not finalized the amount required;
- Article 11, Surface Drains - support;
- Article 15, Senior Center Plans - support;
- Article 16, Noyes School Roof - support;
- Article 17, Conservation Fund Addition - do not take active position as Finance Committee does not support the Article and the position of the Conservation Commission is unknown at this time;
- Article 18, Land Bank - support the general concept;
- Article 19, Update Wetlands Mapping and Survey - support;
- Article 20, Purchase Dickson Land - do not support articles of this magnitude unless there is State funding;
- Article 21, Special Act, Civil Service - support position of Police Chief;
- Article 22A, Amend Zoning Bylaw, Research Districts, Downzoning - work with Planning Board to unify position on reduction of square footage per acre;
- Article 22B, Amend Zoning Bylaw, Research Districts, Rezoning - oppose;

Article 36, Cluster Development - support Planning Board.
STM Articles 4, 5 and 6, LSRHS Incurring and Bonding Indebtedness - support.

Mr. Thompson updated the Board on amendments or positions to be taken by the Park and Recreation Commission and the Youth Commission relative to their budgets and articles.

Relative to the proposed amendment by the Youth Commission to fund the CODE Hotline, which was not recommended by the Finance Committee, it was agreed that if the sum to be proposed was modest, the Board should caucus to confirm support.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
