Call to Order

At 11:38 PM, Chair Roberts called the Executive Session meeting to order.

Town Manager Sheehan provided detail regarding revision to the Opioid Settlement. He detailed that the National Consortium attorneys suggested that communities with populations of less than 50,000, officially withdraw from the Pharmacy Benefit Managers Agreement.

Town Manager confirmed that the pharmaceutical companies involved are still being sued. He added that KP Law (Town Counsel) recommends that Sudbury follow the advice of national counsel.

Vice-Chair Carty motioned that the Town of Sudbury withdraw its assent to amend its complaint in the National Opioid Litigation to add Pharmacy Benefits Managers as defendants, and further move that Town Manager Andrew Sheehan be authorized to execute such documents as are necessary to implement this withdrawal. Board Member Kouchakdjian seconded the motion.

VOTED: That the Town of Sudbury withdraw its assent to amend its complaint in the National Opioid Litigation to add Pharmacy Benefits Managers as defendants, and further move that Town Manager Andrew Sheehan be authorized to execute such documents as are necessary to implement this withdrawal

Vote to close Executive Session and not resume Open Session
