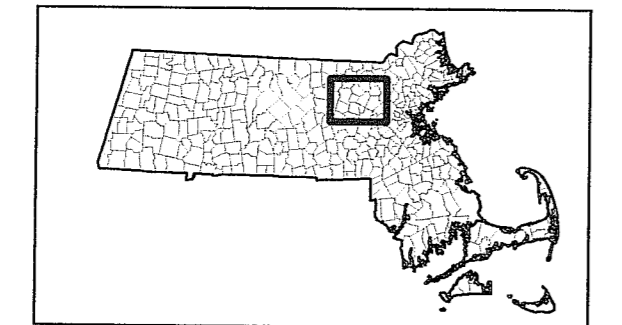

- A-Important wildlife area, Sudbury**
 raccoon, salamander, cottontail rabbit, striped skunk, eastern coyote, mink, turtle spp., snakes, fisher, whitetail deer, woodchuck, turkey, frog spp., beaver, ducks, geese, hawks, vole, mole, shrew, bats, great blue heron, pheasant, fox
- B-Important wildlife area, Sudbury**
 migrating warblers, nesting tanager, wren, nuthatch, treasurers, pileated woodpecker and other woodpeckers, tree swallow, bluebird, kingfisher, cedar wax wing, great horned owl, killdeer, red-tailed and other hawks, great blue and green herons, kestrel, garter and water snakes, common turtles, eastern coyote, mink, muskrat, river otter, beaver, red and gray fox, fisher, bobwhite, bob-o-link, meadow lark, whippoorwill, quail
- C-Assabet River WWR, Stow, Maynard, Sudbury, and Hudson**
 moose, mink, river otter, fisher, beaver, among others
- D-White Pond Park, Concord**
 active great blue heron rookery with 30 active nests, river otter, breeding fisher, mink, turkey, great horned owl, beaver, breeding eastern coyote
- E-Jennie Dagan Brook, Concord**
 river otter, mink, muskrat (high density), beaver, fisher, red fox, eastern coyote, barred and great horned owl, red-tailed hawk, wood duck and other water fowl, nesting bluebirds, kingfisher, green and great blue heron (some overwintering), night heron, spring peepers, tree frog, water snake, garter snake (frequently seen on railroad ROW itself), painted and snapping turtles
- F-Old Rifle Range, Concord**
 eastern coyote, red fox, fisher, whitetail deer, snapping turtle, barred owl
- G-Estabrook Woods, Concord and Carlisle**
 river otter, beaver, mink, fisher, porcupine, eastern coyote, red fox, raptors, wood duck, black bear
- H-Crosby Pond, Concord**
 beaver, mink, river otter, gray fox, red fox, fisher, eastern coyote, muskrat, raptors, great blue heron
- I-Important wildlife area, Concord**
 significant turtle nesting sight

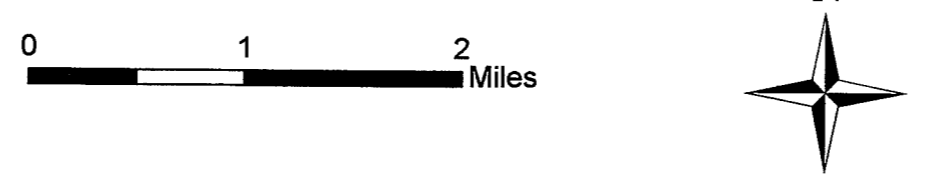
