New England Conservation/Wildlife Mix - Spec Sheet (PDF)

The New England Conservation/Wildlife Mix provides a permanent cover of grasses, wildflowers, and legumes. For both good erosion control and wildlife habitat value. The mix is designed to be a no maintenance seeding, and is appropriate for cut and fill slopes, detention basin side slopes, and disturbed areas adjacent to commercial and residential projects.S: Virginia Wild Rye (Elymus virginicus), Little Bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparium), Big Bluestem (Andropogon gerardii), Red Fescue (Festuca rubra), Switch Grass (Panicum virgatum), Partridge Pea (Chamaecrista fasciculata), Panicledleaf Tick Trefoil (Desmodium paniculatum), Indian Grass (Sorghastrum nutans), Blue Vervain (Verbena hastata), Butterfly Milkweed (Asclepias tuberosa), Black Eyed Susan (Rudbeckia hirta), Common Sneezeweed (Helenium autunale), Heath Aster (Asterpilosus/Symphyotrichum pilosum), Early Goldenrod (Solidago juncea), Upland Bentgrass (Agrostis perennans).



To the Conservation Commission,

We respectfully submit the following plan to the Commission to revegetate the riverfront area of the property located on 31 Beckwith Street.

Letters have been submitted to all abutters within 100 feet by certified mail as of July 5, 2019.

A Notice of Intent has been filed with both the State and the Commission and all fees have been paid as of July 5, 2019.

The activities/disturbances you describe include:

Removal of shrubs (prickers/briars) and requested grass area next to it near riverfront.
 This is a total of 300 square feet and will be mitigated with the following trees and plants:

Shadblow/Serviceberry Bushes (2-3), Swamp Azaleas (2-3). We would like to plant the following trees: River Birch (1)Silver Maple (1-3)

Installation of a swing set.

This is a total of 250 square feet. The structure will be removed. In its place we will plant the following native vegetation in the area:

Highbush Blueberry bushes (3 - 5), Sweet Pepper bushes (2 - 3). We would like to plant the following trees: Silver Maple (1)

Removal of trees due to storm damage.

The square footage of this is difficult to calculate. We will do a combination of Wildlife Conservation seed mix along the banks of the riverfront Raspberry and Blueberry bushes along the sides where the most tree damage from the storm was done.

Several evergreens and 2 Silver Maples have already been planted and established after the storm damage was done.

• We would also assist in the removal of some invasive plants. There are three separate locations of Bittersweet growing on the property as well as a Tree of Heaven. We would remove them all.

There is a Rose of Sharon damaged by the storm located on the side of the house that is entwined with Bittersweet and we would like to remove both.

Thank you for your time and consideration of this matter.
