

12 Antique Circle Project Overview -

- Invasive Species Removal
- Existing Fence Repair
- Brush Control

Details-

Conduct maintenance on my property in the area marked as a wetland (as seen by blue section below) requires the use of various cutting and removal techniques. The extent of the invasive species (Buckthorn and Bittersweet) is pervasive throughout the DEP demarked area of my property.



The shaded area in blue above measures about 8000 square feet but does not represent an accurate depiction of the water that is found on the property during the year. There is generally no standing water or wet mud for most of the seasons, with limited pooling in late winter and early spring. I am petitioning the commission to be able to use handheld mechanical machinery (such as chainsaws or brush trimmers) and potentially herbicides as I believe pulling techniques will have little impact on the territory.

Anticipated Outcome-

My intension is to clear this area of deadfall and the invasive species (Buckthorn and Bittersweet) and repopulate the space with native species off the approved list from the department. I do not wish to add any structures except to remove and replace a dilapidated fence that exists in the Northwest corner of the property. Principally I am just requesting the ability to mow / cut non-native intruders in the late

Fall or early Spring for routine maintenance of the wetland in order to preserve its integrity for local flora, fauna and overall natural aesthetic.

Means of Removal-


In order to complete this project as intended, I will need to go beyond a hand pulling method and employ the use of mechanical mowers, brush saws or herbicides in the most difficult cases to root out the intruding species of Buckthorn and Bittersweet. Much of the Buckthorn has sprouted from larger trunks that have been allowed to grow unabated following the removal of trees from the areas prior to my ownership. I plan to use hand clippers / saws, and mechanical chainsaws or brush saws as a first means to cut back then 6-10ft tall plants this seasons, but believe that it will not be possible to remove the invasive vegetation completely by hand without mechanical or herbicidal means over the coming years.




Timeline-

If approved, this year I would intend on principally cutting back the invasive by hand and with a brush trimmer (Echo 2-stroke Cycle Brush Cutter Trimmer) leaving enough stalk to utilize herbicide for future treatments over subsequent years if permitted. Based on regrowth and the scope of the project, I would be working from the areas closest to the structure of the home and working my way back in the direction to where the wetland is more damp / soggy over the next few years or seasons.


Complete view from house of wetland




Opposite view of the house from inside buckthorn in the wetland




