



SUDBURY CONSERVATION COMMISSION MINUTES
Meeting Minutes of December 28, 2020

Chair Friedlander called the meeting to order under the Wetlands Protection Act and Sudbury Wetlands Administration Bylaw at 6:45 PM.

Minutes:

On motion by R. Morse, seconded by M. Sevier, the Commission voted unanimously, by roll call vote, to approve the minutes of November 30, 2020.

On motion by D. Henkels, seconded by K. Holtz, the Commission voted unanimously, by roll call vote, to approve the minutes of December 10, 2020.

Certificate of Compliance:

44 Maplewood Avenue, DEP File 301-1311:

On motion by D. Henkels, seconded by K Holtz, the Commission voted unanimously, by roll call vote, to issue a Certificate of Compliance for the installation of a generator at 44 Maplewood Avenue.

Continued Wetland Applications:

Notice of Intent: Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority Right-of Way, DEP

File #301-1287:

Chair Friedlander opened the continued Notice of Intent hearing for Eversource/Department of Conservation and Recreation, applicants: Installation of a new 115kV underground electrical transmission line and the construction of a portion of the Mass Central Rail Trail, from the existing Sudbury Substation to the Hudson town line, along the inactive Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority Right-of-Way, in Sudbury, MA, under the State Wetlands Protection Act and the Sudbury Wetlands Administrative Bylaw, last continued from December 14, 2020.

With concurrence from Attorney Barry Fogel, on behalf of the applicant, D. Henkels moved to continue the hearing to January 21, 2021. R. Morse seconded the motion. The Commission so voted unanimously by roll call vote. (K. Holtz abstained.)

Other Business:

Sudbury-Lincoln Adult Education Programs: Coordinator Capone informed the Commission that Neela de Zoysa would like the Commission to sponsor a repeat of the program Ms. De Zoysa offered last year regarding Lincoln and Sudbury's open spaces and would like to add a second program on Sudbury's wildflowers. The Commission fully supports these initiatives.

On motion by R. Morse, seconded by M. Sevier, the Commission voted unanimously, by roll call vote, to support and sponsor both adult education programs.

On motion by K. Holtz, seconded by R. Morse, the Commission voted unanimously, by roll call vote, to adjourn the meeting at 6:57 PM.
