

We removed approximately 15-20 trees from our property in early May 2023. We had instructed our landscaping contractor to prune or remove dead or diseased trees that posed a danger to our house and our family. Some healthy trees were removed within the conservation zone, against our instructions. We also installed a playset in some cleared undergrowth on the north (left) side of the house, also within the conservation zone.

We discharged the landscaping contractor who supervised the earlier work and hired Lynch for general maintenance and replanting services to ensure that the work is done in compliance with regulations. Lynch has been in communication with the Sudbury conservation district this summer and fall.

We intend to replant approximately the same number of new native trees (18 trees) along the sides and rear of our property within the conservation zone and sides of the house, as shown on the attached landscape conservation plan from Lynch. We intend to use <u>eastern hemlock</u>, <u>red maple</u>, <u>sugar maple</u>, <u>tulip poplar</u> and <u>red oak</u>, as well as native bushes. We would like to begin this work in the spring of 2024.

We intend to continue to remove buckthorn and burning bush, both invasive species, as well as poison ivy and bittersweet, from the sides of our property. We have also noticed debris (lawn and tree waste) dumped behind our house in the wetlands (prior to our moving here in April 2020), which we will try to remove to the extent practicable. We would also like permission to prune and remove dead limbs and trees (as discussed with the conservation district) from the property and to level the playset platform with gravel, loam and wood chips, with boulders as a retaining wall.

We may also remove some excess stone and possibly electrical wiring from the area in the back yard where the hot tub had been. We would like to ask permission to rebuild the deck in the back yard (currently 817 sq ft), to install an additional deck on the side of the house (400 sq ft), to replace the existing pavers (565 sq ft) with new permeable pavers in the back yard (adding 75 sq ft), and to create additional porch space using permeable payers in the back yard behind the basement doors (adding 295 sq ft), all as shown on the conservation plan. These changes are all within the conservation zone. We have not committed to this work yet, but anticipate doing so in the next five years.
