# Rationale

- Demographics: seniors approaching one-third town population
- Housing development and increase in affordable (e.g., Chapter 40B, Section 8) options (Coolidge expansion, Avalon, etc.)
- Outcomes:
  - Likely increase in senior residents qualifying as "very low income" because of housing burden
  - o Likely increase in families/residents qualifying as "low to moderate income"
  - o Likely increase in needs for financial and nutritional literacy support
  - o Likely increase in demands on Food Pantry (numbers, transportation)
  - Increasingly pressing demands on transportation infrastructure for seniors, disabled, and for economic development.

# Proposal

Identify, meet, and ensure all stakeholders are aware of various initiatives. Continue to meet and/or communicate regularly. Determine what efforts can be combined (e.g., needs assessments and transportation under Master Plan). Identify priority set of efforts, such as:

- Commitment to AARP/WHO age-friendly communities
- Needs assessments (seniors, economically vulnerable)
- Master Plan
- Infrastructure "fixes" (on-demand transportation demonstrations; re-engineering Food Pantry; classes on financial and nutritional literacy; updated information on all relevant websites, etc.).

Seek multiple sources of funding:

- The Sudbury Foundation (requirements = agreement among Town Manager and relevant town agencies on priorities; additional sources of funds sought/obtained)
- Metrowest Health Foundation
- BayPath (Area Agency on Aging)
- League of Women Voters
- Friends of Sudbury Senior Center (\$3K)
- Other (Robert Wood Johnson)?
