The Town of Sudbury Facilities Department is seeking written responses from persons who customarily perform such work as specified below:

Scope of work:

The Contractor shall furnish at his own proper cost and expense all materials, supplies, machinery, equipment, appliances, accessories, tools, superintendence, labor (Mass. Prevailing Wage Rates apply) insurance, and other items and services necessary to complete the work of the installation of new water pipe at 550 Boston Post Road, Fire Station #2, specifically the installation of a new fire line and the extension of an existing domestic water service. The scope of work includes the following:

- 1. Installation of approximately 20LF of 4" ductile iron water main to extend the current domestic water line north and reconnect with the existing 4" line. It is understood that this line will become the new domestic service for the building.
- 2. Installation of a 12" x 6" tapping sleeve and valve on existing 12" cast iron main on Rt.
- 3. Installation of approximately 40LF of 6" ductile iron from the above tapping sleeve onto the grass area on the East side of the current building. It is understood that this new line will serve as the fire service for the building.
- 4. Installation of a 7" bituminous concrete trench patch on Rt. 20 and a 4" bituminous trench patch in the driveway of the station.

A Permit will be required from the state and work must comply with state highway specifications including the use of controlled density fill for backfilling.

The Contractor agrees to pay laborers and tradesmen to be employed on the project wages in an amount no less than the applicable minimum wage rates (hereinafter prevailing wage rates) established for the project by the Massachusetts Division of Labor Standards. The Contractor agrees to indemnify the awarding authority for, from and against any loss, expense, damages, actions or claims, including any expense incurred in connection with any delay or stoppage of the project work, arising out of or as a result of (1) the failure of the Contractor's bid to be based upon the payment of said applicable prevailing wage rates or (2) the failure of the Contractor to pay laborers employed on the project the said applicable prevailing wage rates. If the contract price exceeds \$25,000, a payment bond in the amount of 50% of the contract price is required. All work and estimates must comply with MGL 30B for state procurement.
