Royce has recently been working on archeology with the Wayland group and he offered the Commission suggestions on next steps to be taken at the Revolutionary Cemetery. He also showed us a book with the oldest Indian bow which was donated by Mr. Goodnow of Sudbury to the Harvard collection.

The minutes of July were accepted as typed. Liz gave the financial report and stated that her neighor Joan MacGilva donated a check for \$50 to be deposited in the E.B.Hosmer Fund. Barbara was given permission to spend \$500 on Christmas Ornaments to be hand painted for sale in December. Duck Soup will arrange Sudbury items for sale in one place in there store and will display our mugs and cup plates. Diana was given permission to spend \$500 on landscaping

All Commission members are to be present that day and Lyn will ask for two or three docents to help.

CPC Update: Jim Hill is meeting with Bud Harworth to go over replacing the hall door, installing molding in the parlor and restoring the gate to the animal pound. All of which will be paid for out of CPC funding.

Fire Surpression System: Jim is going to meet Harold Cutler and Jim Kelly to go over the system that Chubb quoted. Once the bid has been prepared he will involve the Fire Dept.

Cemeteries: The Radar Scanning has been paid for and completed. There are a few stones to be straightened and Kevin will be completing that very soon. Liz will ask him if he has had experience with getting stones that had been found underground.

Chimneys: They are presently in the process of being repaired and we are waiting for the two trees behind the Hosmer House to b e taken down.

FY14 CPC: The application needs to be completed in October. The following are items for consideration: Very old Cemetery Maps at DPW reproduced. Kiosk for Rev Cemetery and Wadsworth. Straighten old slate stones at Wadsworth Cemetery.

Some Commission members met with Marily Ellsworth, Chairman of the League of Women Voters, to advise that we did not support continuing more research on the CGL project. The reasons are documents in their minutes.

Landscaping: Diana was asked to look around the Hearse House to give advice on how to add plantings that are condusive to the old building. She was thanked for taking on the scrapbooks from Adolf and continuing with this project. Looking for book shelf space to store them is something that must be done next.

Hope Sudbury: It was decided to donate a throw and two mugs to their auction.
