4. REQUIREMENTS

This Contract shall be deemed to include all terms required to be included by the Massachusetts General Laws, as though such terms were set forth in full herein.

5. CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

- a) The Contractor agrees to pay laborers and tradesmen to be employed on the project wages in an amount no less than the applicable minimum wage rates (hereinafter prevailing wage rates) established for the project by the Massachusetts Division of Labor and Workforce Development, Division of Occupational Safety. The Contractor agrees to indemnify the awarding authority for, from and against any loss, expense, damages, actions or claims, including any expense incurred in connection with any delay or stoppage of the project work, arising out of or as a result of (1) the failure of the Contractor's bid to be based upon the payment of said applicable prevailing wage rates or (2) the failure of the Contractor to pay laborers employed on the project the said applicable prevailing wage rates.
- b) In accordance with the requirements of M.G.L. c. 149, §27B, the Contractor and all of his subcontractors shall keep a record of hours and wages paid laborers employed on the project and shall submit copies of such records on a weekly basis to the Owner.

6. PERMITS AND REGULATIONS

- a) Permits and licenses necessary for the completion of the work shall be secured by the Contractor.
- b) The Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations bearing on the conduct of the work as drawn and specified. If the Contractor observes that the specifications are at variance therewith, he shall promptly notify the Town in writing, and any necessary changes shall be made. If the Contractor performs any work knowing it to be contrary to such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, and without such notice to the Town, he shall bear all costs arising therefrom.

7. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

The Contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local laws and regulations applicable to this Contract, including the provisions of the

Occupational Safety and Health Act and the regulations of the United States Department of Labor.

8. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

All plans, documents and any data, in whatever form, prepared by the Contractor for submission to the Town shall become the property of the Town.

9. PAYMENT

a)	In consideration of the performance of such acts and services, the

b) Upon completion of all work required under the Contract as awarded, said completion to be to the satisfaction of the Awarding Authority, payment to the Contractor of ninety-five (95%) of the contract will be made. The remaining five percent (5%) shall be retained for not more than sixty (60) days and, if no defects in the work performed, said retained amount shall thereupon be paid over to the Contractor.

10. SITE CONDITIONS

All work described in the Request for Quotations is intended to indicate accurately the scope of the work to be completed. It is not, however, intended to show every detail necessary for every difficulty that may be encountered to carry out the true intent and purpose of such plans and specification. The Contractor shall carefully examine all plans and/or permits available in Town offices, visit the site of the work, and fully inform himself of all conditions which may affect the work or project cost. Submission of a quotation shall constitute acceptance of the site of the work and an understanding of the complete scope of work. The contract documents are complementary, and what is called for by any one shall be as binding as if called for by all. No subsequent allowance shall be made for existing conditions not specifically excluded by the contractor at the time of quotation submission.

11. QUALITY OF WORK

The Contractor represents that he has sufficient ability, experience and expertise to complete all work on the project in accordance with the requirements contained herein. The Contractor shall check and verify all field measurements and conditions. The contractor shall furnish competent workers and services for all parts of the project. All work shall

be subject to inspection by the town or its authorized representative and, if judged not in conformance herewith, shall be subject to rejection and shall be corrected at no extra cost to the Town.

12. COORDINATION

Prior to the commencement of the project, the Contractor shall submit an overview of the project schedule and shall confer with the Sudbury Housing Trust as provided in the Request for Quotations.

13. TIMELY PERFORMANCE

- a) The Contractor shall provide sufficient personnel to perform the work in a prompt and continuous manner.
- b) Contractor shall commence work upon notice to proceed and shall complete all work under this contract prior to August 8, 2008, or as otherwise agreed.
- c) The Contractor shall immediately notify the Town of any difficulties or delays that will prevent completion by the scheduled completion date.

14. PROTECTION OF AFFECTED AREAS

- a) Contractor shall protect the site from unauthorized entry during the process of demolition.
- b) No welding torch or other open flame shall be used within the work area without a fire watch with an appropriate fire extinguisher. During welding operations, all surfaces below where sparks may fall shall be completely protected with non-combustible blankets. The Sudbury Fire Department shall be contacted as to requirements for any welding operation.
- c) Contractor is responsible for the hiring and payment of Police Paid Detail in accordance with the applicable wage rates, if recommended by the Police Chief.

15. REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF MATERIALS

The Contractor shall remove all debris generated during the project from the site for disposal in an EPA-approved landfill acceptable to authorities having jurisdiction.

16. INSURANCE

- a) The Contractor shall maintain insurance in accordance with the Schedule provided and attached hereto, naming the Town as an additional insured with regard to liability insurance.
- b) The Contractor understands that stored equipment is entirely at his risk, including damage or loss through fire and theft, and he will be held responsible and liable for its safety. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to purchase and maintain such other insurance coverage as he may deem necessary.

17. SURETY

The successful Contractor to whom the contract is awarded shall provide a labor and materials bond to the Town through a bonding company authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or other surety acceptable to the Town, in the amount of 50% of the quoted price.

18. INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor shall indemnify, defend and save harmless the Town and all of its officers, agents and employees against all costs, damages, suits and claims of liability of every name and nature arising out of the negligence or intentional wrongful act of the Contractor in the performance of this Contract and shall indemnify the Town for any third-party claim arising out of injuries to Contractor's employees or others performing services for the Contractor directly or indirectly.

19. WORK TO BE PERFORMED BY OWNER

The Sudbury Housing Trust shall be responsible for filling all excavated areas at the conclusion of the project.

20. TERMINATION

By seven (7) days written notice to the Contractor, the Town may terminate this contract at any time. If any such termination shall occur without the fault of the Contractor, all compensation and reimbursement due to the Contractor up to the date of termination, in accordance with all Contract terms, including proportionate payment for completed portions of uncompleted work, shall be paid to the Contractor by the Town. Such payment shall not exceed the fair value of the work, as the Town shall determine.

21. NOTICES

Any notice required under this Contract to be given by the Town to the Contractor, or by the Contractor to the Town, shall be by certified mail, postage prepaid by, respectively, the Town to the Contractor at the address specified for the Contractor on Page 1 hereof, and the Contractor to the Sudbury Housing Trust to the attention of Beth Rust, Community Housing Specialist, 278 Old Sudbury Road, Sudbury, MA 01776.

22. NO WAIVER

Neither the Town's review, acceptance of, nor payment for any work furnished hereunder, shall constitute a waiver of any rights under the Contract or any cause of action arising out of the performance of the Contract. The Town's failure in any instance to insist upon the Contractor's full compliance with the requirements of this Contract shall not operate as a waiver of the right to demand full compliance in the future, nor an acceptance of less than full compliance.


