## Article 23: Sudbury Housing Trust

- 2006 Town Meeting authorized creation of the Housing Trust
  - Allows for quick response and implementation of housing projects, with a focus on homeownership
- 2007 Town Meeting funds Trust in start up mode
  - Able to make immediate progress
- 2008 Town Meeting continues to support Trust
  - Continued success of articulated goals



## Article 23: Massachusetts Housing Status

- State mandates 10% of a community's housing must be affordable
- The Trust has demonstrated progress by creating affordable homeownership options for members of the community



## Article 23: Sudbury Housing Status

- Our average home price is \$683,800
- Homeownership is beyond the reach for teachers, police, Town employees, and service professionals
- Sudbury has 4.7% of its housing stock as affordable units



## 1. Home Preservation Program

- Purchase deed restrictions on existing homes, converting them to affordable homeownership units in perpetuity
- Preserves neighborhoods by halting "Tear-downs"









#### 2. Small Development

- Habitat For Humanity project
- Maynard Road development









# Maynard Road Concepts





#### 3. 40B Buy-Down Units

- Trust to buy-down additional units in private 40B developments, when built
- Negotiated three additional units restricted in 40B developments, and close on one of those in Fiscal Year 2009









#### 4. Small Grants Program

- Provides financial grants for health and safety repairs
- Assists income eligible seniors (and others) to stay in their homes
- 7 grants awarded, 5 to senior households









## 5. Community Housing Office

- Monitor and enforce deed restrictions
- Qualify applicants for housing, maintain waiting list, administer lotteries

Represents the 10% CPA mandated housing allocation to continue the Sudbury Housing Trust activities

- Additional Home Preservation program units
