#### **Public Comment**

A few ideas on disability etiquette...

- 1- Should I bend down when speaking to someone in a wheelchair?

  The natural way to communicate with someone in a wheelchair is to find a chair/seat and/or naturally stand or kneel.
- 2- What's the best way to speak to someone with hearing loss? Do not shout! It will distort your words. Good lighting is key. Be sure you have the person's attention by facing him/her/it/them. Find a quiet space, speak clearly, and reinstate when necessary.
- 3- Who should you speak to if the person with dementia has a caregiver? Speak to the actual person the question is intended for. Wait 60-90 seconds for the person to respond. Remain patient.
- \*Take away message\*: We're all the same whether we have a particular condition or not. Everyone deserves to be treated with respect!

- Student Enrollment Report
   Kirsteen Patterson, Director of Finance and Operations
  - -As of October 1, 2022 there are 1,483 students enrolled at LSRHS campus. In comparison to last October 1 count of campus-based enrollment of 1,513 students. Campus based enrollment does not include out-of-district or tuitioned-in students. The campus based enrollment has a 2.0% decline from prior year.
  - -LSRHS currently has 171 students enrolled from Lincoln; 1,191 students enrolled from Sudbury; 89 students enrolled in the METCO program; 32 students with tuition waivers.



-With the new Partners autism program located within LSRHS, the district was able to keep students in-house with a reduction of out-of-district placements totaling 49 students. Last year and the year prior were COVID years and the Out of District placements were higher totaling 53 students out-of-district placements at October 1, 2021 and 54 at October 1, 2020.



The impact of 7th and 8th grade students moving through the local middle schools to LSRHS is important to monitor for overall high school enrollment. LSRHS is trending a trickling decline in enrollment at all grade levels with a significant decline projected in FY2026 and 2027. We look forward to leveling out in FY2028 and hope the impact is less than projected for those subsequent years. We must remain cognizant of the slow decline within the next couple of years.


-Fine Arts Theater Arts (FATA) classes are decreasing significantly. Will be taking a look at this department for budgeting reasons.
