





Park & Rec does a wonderful job with the town fields. Haskell is overused, resulting in entire seasons of non-use for regeneration. The importance of healthy fields for the long term is much more important than the short term scheduling issues. The Davis Field plan was a good alternative. The traffic study should be done before voting next time. outdoor spray park for kids

Better maintenance. We miss the beginning of every soccer season. Also, the Davis field could be more useful. And, there is so much baseball going on, seems like the fields could be in better condition - especially the ones at the elementary schools.

We have baseball fields that our youngest kids play on without infield dirt (crime lab) - or are just piles of dirt (Nixon). Insufficient grass fields for volume of use. Poor condition of some fields.

We've been told recently that due to field closures due to overuse, we're unable to practice. Open space fields (e.g. for soccer and lacrosse) are desperately needed or we will need to take our kids out of town to play club. Bike path

As mentioned earlier, it would be a shame if Davis Fields ends up like other fields that really are not used except for sports. The fields setup simply do not allow for the enjoyment of passive recreation that is enjoyed by so many at Davis Fields. Supposedly, people are being told that Park and Rec plans to consider that with the design at Davis Field. However, I remember when the town was told that the town was going to find another spot for lax fields when baseball took over the space at Featherland and it literally took years for that to happen......So, I don't really trust that. It is important to design the field with the dog walkers, flyers etc in mind and guarantee that there will desirable weekend hours that sports teams will not use the field.

The Sudbury Listening Project final report urges the Town to explain decisions more. That may cause trouble in the short run, but, in the long run, it pays off, IMHO.

Keep doing a great job! Imagine a wet dog emerging from a pool of negativity and unjust criticism and do as Taylor Swift says and "Shake it off!" acquiring Morse Road horse farm could be a nice opportunity to complement Featherland fields and BFRT corridor, and valuable vernal pool areas while also preserving Sudbury's most notable privately-owned viewscape.

Question 20 is very misleadingly phrased.

We're tired of constant override votes. Get things planned properly and into a regular budget.

Communication in this town is terrible. All the "cool kids" seem to know what's going on, plusses and minuses, etc, while the rest of us who are interested but not regularly visiting Selectmen meetings are left to piece together what's really going on. Take the rail trail thing. Is voting "YES" actually voting for a rail trail, or is it voting to wait for Nstar, or is it voting to wait for the state, or what? Where is the place where I can go find out?

I do NOT support use of town funds to prevent lower income/rental construction as occurred with the recent Johnson Farm issue. That was deeply embarrassing and elitist. More organized activities linking people of similar interests. Possibly a tennis tournament like there are town organized road races.

Reach out to LS to see what more can be offered to the town. Maybe link LS adult Ed offerings with park & rec.
I'd love to see more emphasis on maintaining the recreation area/ fields that we have as opposed to creating new ones.

I feel like there is definitely a shortage of recreational activities for upper elementary/middle school age children. I would love to see a sprinkler park and perhaps a playground /parkour/ area designed for older kids. It would be great for them to have similar opportunities that other age groups in town have. There seem to be tons of opportunities for senior citizens and younger children in town.

Question #20 is poorly constructed and will result in misleading findings. The options presented are not comprehensive. A town-funded, fast-track trail does NOT have to be soft surface. There should be an option for a town-funded paved trail. Incremental cost based on Wayland's research is \$120K/mile, which is same as Rail to Trail Conservancy estimates and total cost of ownership is less than stone dust.

I feel it is premature to voice any opinion on the development of Melone until a full and complete survey has been done on the toxicity of the land.

It is extremely disappointing to see that an outdoor pool is not part of the Atkinson Community Center redevelopment plan. The town not only loses an incredible amount of money to private pools in Marlborough, Concord, Lincoln and 2 private pools in Sudbury to name a few, but many families cannot afford the price those pools charge to be members. An outdoor summer pool and splash park would be a huge asset to the town. Perhaps build the new pool at Atkinson with a bubble that could be removed in the summer.

I strongly support the immediate rail trail project. This is the only way that I will be able to use the trails with my family. It is a small cost per household with a big benefit on the quality of life for residents (otherwise I have to drive 20-40 minutes away for similar amenities). It will also benefit local businesses that are near the rail trails.

Davis field should be preserved as publc use open space. Many folks use it for exercise, socializing, and nature watching. There is not enough dedicated open space in Sudbury for people of all ages to congregate, since there are no open parks.

When we first moved to Sudbury, we heard long-tenured neighbors lament the increased development within the town. Now being here for 14 years ourselves, I believe the town has done a commendable job in preserving places that make Sudbury special.

It is not easy, nor inexpensive, but is so very important for both current & future residents.

I think the focus of the survey is exactly right: Preserving space and also linking these lands to maximize the opportunity to explore & enjoy them. In an era when car transportation needs are at such a high priority, this is very difficult to do but I believe it is just so important.

We have such a beautiful town with a rich history. I would love to see every effort made to preserve the nature of the town, to connect our neighborhoods and create safe walkways for our children, especially.

I would like to see Sudbury preserved - the reason we moved here was because of Sudbury's unique position as a true bridge between urban and rural living - developing our town center would be wonderful, and connecting the northern area of town to the historic center via a soft bed rail trail would benefit so many residents - families and empty nesters. Anything that connects our community is a strengthening force. I often see the same people out walking and enjoying our trails. I would also like to see the Featherland courts fixed - but not completely replaced - they only need to be good enough to be safe - they don't have to be competition-grade courts. So much emphasis is put on sports fields, I'd like to see a return to a focus on preservation and conservation.

Please, no selectmen should work for a developer or corporate entity and represent the town! Given the benefit of the doubt, it is still very difficult to serve two masters and serve both to best of your abilities. No matter what your intentions are.

#12 - I did not want to answer because I am not sure of the need, but the survey would not let me answer that way.

I dream of a walkable town center with a small two movie theatre, a bakery, and family owned stores!

Fix the tennis courts, do not turn them into parking or other uses. I think Davis field should be re-done so it drains and can be used for sports in the Spring. If people don't want ball fields there then fix the fields at the elementary schools and Curtis and then lock them during school so the kids don't destroy them. If the schools don't like it take the maintenance out of each school budget and bill them if the town has to make repairs.

Enough with the fields for the sports community. Sudbury is more than this user group and the number of kids enrolled in the schools is decreasing.

thank you for offering the survey. It feels like a few are charged with the responsibility and as a result, it often feels inaccessible and difficult to have a voice. this is great.

Rather than take away space (such as Davis Field) to support baseball/soccer, use other space (Melone) and invest in existing fields (Nixon, Loring, etc) to help meet the need. More needs to be done to preserve agriculture in Sudbury.

There is a total omission of organized sports (aside from the "Active Recreation" question on Melone) in this survey. I don't do organized sports, but given the Davis Field article at Town Meeting, there is a perceived need in the community for playing fields that should be addressed in the OSRP. If it's not a town priority, state that explicitly.

The Town should actively pursue getting the rights to use the inactive rail lines in town from their various responsible parties (DOR, MassDOT, CSX).

If the town is going to build walkways, the town needs to clear, plow and maintain them. Costs for these services should be called out in the budget and factored in when proposing new walkway construction.

The town should develop an organized plan for acquiring Chapter 61 properties on which we have right of first refusal, including both scheduling the steps of the process to meet the deadlines and having funds available that don't require a special town meeting.

The town should not be allowing private interests or single- sport interest to influence development for their own desires. Thought and input needs to be taken from all Sudbury residents. Results should be quantitative not based on "show of hand" and influenced by who shows up.

I would really like to see the Melone property turned into a giant recreational area with something for everyone, including (but not limited to):

- an outdoor town pool and/or a spray park
- multi-use sports fields
- baseball/softball fields - tennis courts
- a community track
- walking trails
- concessions
- BATHROOMS/changing rooms
- a driving range (golf)
- dog park
- a playground equipped for special needs
- pavilions that can be rented for parties
- a volleyball court

- I want Park & Rec to honor the town's voted interest in not developing Davis field (what is wrong with you guys??!!!!)

My children grew up in Sudbury, but haven't participated in organized sports. Instead they've done lots of other Parks and Rec programs, done Earth Day clean ups, Relay for Life and walked every trail in town 100 times. I have sometimes felt that Sudbury forgets about kids like them. We have become a town that is so gung ho about our sports teams, we forget that a big chunk of our population doesn't participate in those teams. For my kids, Davis Field has been a godsend. They have played with the dog, walked the perimeter, explored the wetlands, had picnics with friends and launched rockets with their dad. Davis is perfect exactly as it is. And the only place of its kind for kids like mine. You've heard many voices like mine by now. Why not listen to them? Leave Davis field alone.

The preservation of Davis Field in its current condition is essential for our enjoyment of the open spaces. This multi-use field is a rare gem that will only become more valuable. Walkways are critical. Dutton Road from Pratt's Mill to Tanbark without a walkway is treacherous - and we walk it regularly.

More emphasis on developing other options ie tennis courts, walking, biking, hiking trails

I thought Davis Field had already been voted on and determined to saved for open space! Leave Davis alone - it is an open recreation space that is used for ALL. Everyone wants Malone built. Make it happen please!!!

I was at the Town Meeting evening regarding the Davis Field debate. I have two children (middle school and elementary school). I coach Sudbury youth sports and have done so for over 4 years. I oppose the repositioning of Davis Field for more than what it is currently used for today passive recreation and in-town soccer for very young kids (Kindergarten / first grade?).

Sudbury has underutilized assets that are in need of repair and which, if upgraded can serve multiple user groups. I specifically cite the elementary school fields. I acknowledge the conditions of these fields needs to be improved. Investment in improving (regrading, replanting grass, etc.) seems to be a logical response to improving fields for our kids during school hours and for after hour sports activities. At Town Meeting, I heard the cost to improve and maintain the school fields made this option not viable. I find this hard to believe. If we cannot maintain our existing assets we should not build new assets.

All recreational amenities, including rail trails, should be designed and built in compliance with all local bylaws and state & federal law(s). If a proposed recreational amenity can not be designed and built in full compliance then alternate sites and right of ways should be considered and utilized for said amenity. This is with the understanding some mitigation may be acceptable under the law(s). Sudbury's master plan has always placed environment (wetland bylaws, storm water bylaws, and wildlife consideration) ahead of recreation and development. Let us honor the opinion of the majority of the voters when, and only when, that majority opinion does not require exclusion of the bylaws. I am for paved rails and I think the town is doing the right thing by waiting for the funds even if it will take a little longer. Please make sure people who are organizing to clean up the trails on their own have proper permissions and supervision to make sure our natural habitats are preserved. Check the One Sudbury facebook group for info on what people are planing to do.

Post on the Sudbury group important messages such as the one about the beaver dams being removed by people.

I think Sudbury offers a lot of variety of recreation and open spaces. I do not want the town or tax payers to have hardship by continuing to expanding. I'll all for preserving nature and open spaces and trying to accommodate linking these areas, but only when causing undue burden on the Town budget or tax payers or land owners who abut those areas (e.g. I fell bad for the land owners who moved to Subdury to enjoy more of nature and soon will have a paved rail trail with loss of wildlife and perfect view of more concrete with an increase of noise & waste pollution). Sometimes the few are burdened for the good of the many --- I think Sudbury has enough existing recreational/space opportunities so that no one should be burdened other than maintaining what exists. Thank you!

Adding bike trails should be an immediate priority. Preserve the use of Davis Field for radio control (or identify a better facility).

North sudbury feels like not well developed compare to center or south, that is why the house prices in center or south increased a lot, while north is still not very popular in sudbury. I noticed new homes are being built along route 117. I do not know how much the land was sold to the developer, but I feel it is better to preserve that space for commercial use (e.g rent to commercial) than to just sell it to build homes. The land price is surely underestimated. Also, building affordable houses/condos will not bring sudbury too much profit, however, may to some extent, lower the market value of houses in sudbury. If more space could be used to build commertial use, even as kids program, the profit is long-term and will bring more and more people in sudbury. If sudbury is getting more and more popular in greater boston area, such as brookline (although this is not too reasonable), the town budget will be increased, since more people or investors will be interested in putting money here Would love to see a more informative, easy to access town website.

We love the many places we can hike in Sudbury.

I think we have enough playing fields in town. I get very tired of the never ending pleas for more fields supported by studies done by the same consulting firm year after year. Given all the enormous yards in town, can't children play in their own yards????

We need to stop trying to jam in low income housing projects and protect our open space.

I'm all about walking ability. I mentioned the rail road tracks above. That is a priority for me, but equally important are sidewalks. Marlboro Road was passed for sidewalks 15+ years ago and yet nothing has happened there. Because we were just under 2 miles to Nixon (1.95 to be exact) we had to pay for bus service. I found it unreasonable to charge for bussing when there was no sidewalk to use instead. We did walk many times because the kids enjoyed it and it was a great way to start the day, but the Marlboro Rd part was dangerous at 7:00. Also We can't safety walk the other direction on Marlboro to the fields at Haskell.

If planners start looking at walking patterns, they'd see that the loop of Marlboro, Mossman and Willis make up a very popular 3 mile loop. Marlboro and Willis have areas without sidewalks - Marlboro being the busiest. I'm sure there are plenty of similar walking loops in town.

I want to see a detailed list of what the par n rec spends money on full disclosure of the last 10 years of funds cost and money sitting on the bank. I want the building of new houses to stop. Leave the wooded area alone. No rail trail. Figure out what to do with Raytheon property. Get rid of the board members who are part box the corruption in this town

Do what you can without pushing out old townies that can't afford to live here if taxes keep going up. PLEASE See above commentary about 40B.

Two further notes:

- I am dead against any artificial turf sports venues in town. Having played on Lexington's artificial fields I believe it is a tremendous waste of money and precious resources. Grass works just fine.
- I would be delighted to see accelerated progress regarding the rail trail but get confused as to what the town's position is, particularly with the new addition of the Greenways effort.

I'm concerned that there appears to a continued focus of overpaying for wetlands purchases. As mentioned in the beginning Haskell field has been under heavy use for the past 4-5 years and yet the town appears to be more willing to pay \$1-\$2 million to purchase wetlands, and not to provide improvements to space that can be used for both active and passive recreational space.

CPA funds should not be used for sidewalks.

Large-scale CPA funds should not be used for ballfields or for artificial turf.

In Order of Priority:

- 1) lobby hard/quickly to repeal 40B
 - -- we have to outspend the contractors to get this repealed
 - -- contractors are lining their pockets under this law
- -- they don't care that they destroy towns in the process
- 2) pave the bike trial & connect to other towns
- 3) buy every vacant property we can before a developer gets it

No need to spend money/time/brainpower on awareness or tours. Word of mouth in Sudbury is very effective, as are the newspapers (Town Crier & Globe).

Trail head signs are delipitated and falling down (see Hop brook). Another example of no upkeep - only build new. Other "trail heads" have signs and boards that are a waste (two on Marlboro road). Land to knowhere.

I am fully in support of a more aggressive approach to sidewalks. There is heavy traffic in and around many of the open space and rec areas and would very much like to get to them safely.

Linking the spaces is a great idea as well. The new space in the center of town is nice but I don't think I've ever seen people there aside from parades as it is a standalone island.

Sudbury has become overdeveloped.

Lets preserve open space and enhance the fields that we already have for athletic purposes. A great example is the field at Haynes School. It is never used for town sports. We can improve the ball fields at Noyes, Haynes, Nixon and Loring rather than funding major projects at new locations. Do good athletes really need the perfectly manicured fields? If we build new fields at Davis for example the next step will be to add lights, loudspeakers, etc....We live in one of the most beautiful historic farm towns in Massachusetts and most of us probably moved here due to our love of the history and open space. Lets take pride in the unique landscape of this town. Towns with all of the "bells and whistles" are typically found closer to Boston. Lets preserve our open spaces and have pride and respect for the history of this town.

Please perform traffic studies when proposing any open space efforts in Sudbury. Development of infrastructure is greatly ignored in Sudbury.

Some of the questions are not yes or no answers, and cannot be answered as is. For example, I don't understand why affordable housing is lumped in with open space, recreation, and conservation.

As active and heavy users of recreation fields, I believe there are ample rec fields, and favor preservation over development.

Whether to expand current areas or build new ones depends on which is more cost effective (I believe the former).

I really do not know enough to have an opinion on which parts of town are best to enhance, the Melone gravel pit, and other items I left unmarked.

We have some great spaces in town and it would be great to see everyone work together to augment these parcels.... The Ford plant, the odd desert formation, toppling rock, the Boy Scout area...

Our side walks are an embarrassment...big money is being spent along the road from the Concord development to nowhere while everything else is in bad shape or non existent.

The school parcels have some potential, but are so poorly maintained that they are useless to the community as a whole. Take for example, the soccer and baseball field at Loring.

It appears as if this town has zero desire to reinvest in its properties.

My family and I are relatively new to Sudbury. All the above sounds great - I am not aware of town finances and I assume not all proposals above can be executed upon.

My priorities would be to ensure kids can walk and bike to school SAFELY. It's maybe not a Parks and Rec concern but car traffic and driver behavior is extremely dangerous, with little to no regards to pedestrians or cyclists.

With regards to soccer and baseball fields, they appear to be busy but only during select times, like the weekends. Using the school fields (four elementary, Curtis and LS) and using any lighting system there would appear to be an easier and less expensive way to expand fields.

Finally, would be nice to have adequate baseball fields available for adults. Right now, I can see Sudbury Little League pushing out adult softball.

Addition of the outdoor rink last year was a bonus, but all work was done by volunteers, would be nice if the town helped out a bit more with maintenance. THX! I love the idea of a recreational building being developed on 117. Great opportunity there.

Some of these choices are too either or so and answer may be yes with no trade-off. I might say go ahead and turn Malone into open space if you develop Davis Field if cost to develop Davis is cheaper.

Maintenance of active outdoor recreational facilities is miserable. Before expanding formal recreational areas, we should improve maintenance of what we already have.

Leave room for passive recreation. We don't need a baseball diamond everywhere! Davis Field is a prime example of what our town has and needs to round out its public offerings. As for Featherland, it now looks like a prison yard with all the fencing around.

It can be done! Every time I go to Concord I see the success of mixed use of active recreations facilities on public land, not only by the activities offered but also for the varied age groups present. Specific examples are Rideout Park and Emerson Park. Both of these accommodate mixed use from kindergarten to retirement.

Chuck Woodard cited that more than 500 acres have been purchased and/or set aside in the last decade for open space in Sudbury. How much more open space do we need without first meeting the needs of the thousands of kids and families that play youth sports and need more field space?

How can land, like Davis, be Deeded by a family for active recreation, yet have the opportunity to get voted down for field space? I doubt conservation land in this town could be voted on to turn into field space. Why is this allowed to happen for land specifically DEEDED by the family for active recreation?

Park and Rec needs to do a better job linking all the user groups together for a cohesive funding and voting to pass Articles. It is not feasible for working parents to sit around for 3 nights and vote. Of course this is weighted towards our seniors who are happy to sit there each night, vote for tax relief for themselves, yet vote down field space. We need to improve our athletic fields. We have very robust youth programs that help keep our kids engaged, healthy and "off the street". Right now it is very difficult to find a field and some of them are so overused they are already brown and burnt out by middle of May. It is frustrating when items like lighting at turf fields could extend the use (especially in late fall) are not supported by the Town officials and citizens. If you are a teenager there is not a tremendous amount "to do around town" and the sports programs are some of the best options. It would also be nice to have some better toilet facilities at some of the fields.

One other thing - it is nice to combine activities such as having walking paths around the fields so that parents can get exercise walking/jogging while waiting for kids at practice. I really like being able to walk the mown paths at Davis Field for instance.

We need to think more carefully about the large developments that have been going in. The are changing the character of the town. Wetlands are essential. I have children that play sports. We don't need money for more fields, we need to preserve the rural/suburban character of the town. The rail trail, if it does go in should be soft. I am opposed to hard topping for environmental reasons, and because I don't think that bikes and foot traffic mix well. I also don't want to see the trash/crime/and trail "traffic" from other towns. We should purchase properties offered to the town, but the wording in question 27 above is all or nothing: "purchase ALL properties offered...regardless of size or location." We should purchase when it makes sense from an environmental and economic standpoint. I grew up in this town. I know it can't look like it did 40 some years ago, but the amount of development we have allowed is heartbreaking. Use the Community Preservation Fund to PRESERVE. turf fields if they aren't cancer causing rubber turf.

renovate Atkinson Building is a MUST.

There are not enough soccer, baseball, lacrosse fields to go around for youth programs. We have to share field practice space or get bumped from practice space if a game is scheduled on our field. It is time to figure out where additional fields can be constructed - prefer grass but understand turf fields are the rage.

My strongest opinion is that we use open space for recreation (passive or active) and prevent further development. The town is too crowded as it is, traffic is way too heavy for the roads to handle as it is. I would prefer active recreation be developed, but would easily settle for passive recreation over further development of any open space. Further development will also tax the environment with possible groundwater contamination. We are luck in Sudbury that our underground water sources have been preserved so far, further development can only harm these water sources and create even worse traffic.

I deplore the spin denigrating the non- "Greenway" alternatives in the phrasing of the question on the rail trail. It has been astudy in how to do nothing constructive over a deplorable number of years.

I think that Sudbury residents (based on many interviews) desire a paved BFRT, and are not interested in a crushed stone path. Of those I have had had discussions with regarding the rail trail issue, they are emphatically against Sudbury Greenways' proposal. Please do the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail properly to benefit everyone. Pave it so it can be used by children, adults and the elderly alike. Thanks.

Do your best. I have seen the discussions at Town Meeting and they can be frustrating. I was disappointed by the Cutting Field lights and Davis field improvements.

Get more people using Park and Rec assets who normally might not. The Sudbury Sprint Tri and Halloween 5K are awesome. Create more 5k events but put them on public lands. At these events, remind people they are taking advantage of Park and Rec assets.

I value the town's efforts in promoting an active healthy lifestyle. This is of far greater importance to me than simply conserving land to avoid future development or preserve wetlands. We need to balance the use of funds for activities that people of all ages will use, keeping in mind that the future of our town depends much more heavily on the families who live here and will move here than it does the older residents. If we focus only on the number and quality of sport fields (baseball and soccer), those children who play those sports will benefit but what have we given up for the rest of our residents? Pathways/walkways can be used by everyone. Should we create new ball fields because those at the elementary schools aren't "in good shape"? Noyes currently has two fields- only one of which is used regularly by the school. Can't we renovate the other that is there to please the baseball folks? Could we create a soccer field in between the two baseball fields at Noyes? Thinkcreatively

why do we need to wait 10+ year to build a paved rail trail? Seems like the town has consistently voted in favor of this proposal for the past 10 years and nothing has happened. Greenway is better than nothing but it would be helpful to see/hear an independent summary as to why the paved option will take decades.

Sidewalks should be a priority - in particular sidewalks along busier roads need to be designed with a buffer (thinking along Maynard Road - that sidewalk is useless - right on top of the road, crosses over 27 multiple times at insane locations).

We have enough fields. Put some money into Davis, Haynes, Noyes, Nixon, etc... and upgrade those fields. I'd also vote for more multi-use grass fields (ie not baseball as those limit other uses (Lax,soccer, football, fieldhockey, etc...). No one has talked about indoor facilities but could use a Fieldhouse type complex for indoor soccer/lacrosse/basketball/volleyball/hockey) - maybe at the soon vacant Raytheon or Malone.

The open land is key to preserving Sudbury's history and scenic beauty. A community art space/studios would also be nice as a collective center for artists and those interested in learning about the arts.

I feel that the many trails in town are perfect for walks etc. We have miles of trails. Adding more field space for youth activities is going to be a benefit for everyone. This is a town of young people. The schools are great and that brings in the young families. our property value will increase if more amenities are available for these families. Having more field space gives the opportunity for many more sport and recreation activities for the kids. My own family has older teenagers. We are already done with the need for fields. But, I do feel strongly that it only makes the town more desirable and will increase my own house value.

The town needs to realign its priorities and stop the ongoing open space manifest destiny - it is not sustainable and drains limited resources from other needed capital improvements such as schools, buildings, athletic fields and yes, economic development. Focus should be put on increasing the commercial tax base through real estate development. Real estate is driven by growth, growth in population, income and jobs - in order to be financially sustainable the Town needs economic sustainability. Davis Field should have ball fields for the future of Sudbury and its community strength.

Do not let 40B housing destroy our valuable open space and wetlands.

Raytheon should be developed to complete our 40B obligation.

We need to change how the town votes on proposals. The vote on the field occurred at 11pm on a weeknight, and was decided by 300 people. For those with kids, that is a very difficult time.

Wording of question 20 seems biased, which will impact meaning of results.

We have a great town. There are many recreational opportunities here and would like to see grow community awareness and shared responsibility for the future of these. Would be very good to add more recreational fields where open spaces already exist to use. Recommend that Davis Field be continued to be looked at for upgrade as there is much space available to use effectively without removing woodlands.
