Chief of Police

On October 20th Sudbury Detectives responded to Lahey Hospital in Burlington to interview a female victim regarding unknown circumstances. During the interview, Detectives learned the victim had been severely beaten while being held against her will at a Sudbury residence. Additionally, the suspect threatened to kill her and her child in trying to intimidate her from reporting circumstances to authorities. The identity of the suspect was confirmed whereby he was placed under arrest for a litany of charges, following a motor vehicle stop on Boston Post Road in Sudbury. He was transported to the Sudbury Police Department for booking where he was initially cooperative but turned belligerent, uncooperative and violent.

In light of the numerous struggles/altercations that occurred in securing Mr. Bozier in a cell/booking room, the suspect was evaluated by the Sudbury Fire Department for a small cut to his finger. He then complained of other medical ailments resulting in him being transported to Emerson Hospital in Concord, twice, where he was cleared both times by medical professionals. During the altercations, several officers sustained scrapes, cuts and bruising but medical treatment was not necessary.

Ultimately, Peter Bozier (28) of 693 Boston Post Road in Sudbury was arrested and charged with the following:

Kidnapping
Strangulation
Assault and Battery
Assault and Battery with a Dangerous Weapon (2 counts)
Intimidation of a Witness
Assault and Battery on a Police Officer (2 counts)
Threats to Commit a Crime
Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle
Marked Lanes Violation

Bozier was transported to the Framingham District Court on October 21st where he was held pending a dangerous hearing scheduled for next week. We would like to thank the Concord Police Department and the Massachusetts State Police in assisting with controlling Bozier in transporting him from the hospital. We would also like to thank the Sudbury Fire Department as well as the Emerson medical staff in ensuring Bozier's health even with his belligerence.
