Horse Pond

Horse Pond is significant since it is the source of Dudley Brook, which eventually flows into Hop Brook. There is public access from Washington drive and it is surrounded by businesses on Route 20 and two homes. It is a habitat for wild birds.







Blandford Pond

Blandford Pond is located on the private property of Cavicchio Greenhouses.
According to the Gazetteer of the State of Massachusetts published in 1890, "Blandford Pond (is a) fair and valuable sheet of water stored with perch and other edible fish." Today it is a captive water source of Cavicchio Greenhouses and outflows into Hop Brook.



Pond G1

Pond G1 is a privately owned pond on Peakham Rd. It contains many tadpoles and has an outlet to the Northeast.





Pond G2

Pond G2 Is commonly known as Douglas Pond. It is adjacent to Douglas Drive and is formed by a dam on the north end through which there is an outlet to a wetland to the NW. Dudley Brook flows through this wetland. The pond is fed by springs and storm drains. Beaver dams that form near the outlet at the man-made dam influence the height of the pond. Many birds and other wildlife frequent this pond.



Pond G3

Pond G3 is located next to Horse Pond Rd. adjacent to the State Crime Lab. The pound is both surrounded by and filled with trees. It has an outlet, which flows into Dudley Brook.
