<u>Topo Maps</u>

The topo maps will be placed in the Town Hall, Flynn Building, DPW Building, Goodnow Library, and the following schools: Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School, Curtis, Haynes, Loring, Nixon, and Noyes.

An 8.5 x11" interpretive sign was created and ten copies were made and put in Lucite frames. The sign has a series of questions, including asking the readers to locate their homes and watershed area. It also describes a watershed.

Dave Blohm and Susan Crane will present the maps to the selectmen on June 23. Frank Lyons will help Dave put the maps in Dave's car on 6/23. Susan Crane will contact Jody Kablack and Mary McCormack to coordinate logistics with the PWC to place the maps in the Flynn Building and the Sudbury Town Hall, respectively.

Revolving Fund

Susan stated that she is waiting to hear from the Town regarding a revolving fund.

NPDES Permit Schedule Implementation

Several weeks ago, Frank Lyons received a reply from the EPA in response to his letter expressing concern about the delay in the NPDES permit schedule for upgrading the Marlborough Easterly Wastewater Treatment Plan, which discharges into Hop Brook.

Frank called Ken Moraff, Acting Director of the Office of Ecosystem Protection, to get a status report regarding the schedule. Frank later got a phone call from Roger Jansen, Chief of the Municipal NPDES Branch, who told Frank that the schedule is still being worked out. Frank plans to keep Sudbury Selectman, John Drobinski, informed about the NPDES permit schedule for upgrading the Marlborough Easterly Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Eco-Friendly Lawn Sign

The Eco-Friendly Lawn Sign_program was very successful and the PWC is pleased with the results. Susan stated that Mike Dufault emailed participants to inform them to take the residential lawn signs down on May 31. Participants can hold onto the signs and put them back up in the fall.
