Administrative

The December 2016 PWC minutes were approved.

The PWC welcomed Ms. Melissa Gough and Ms. Marge Keene to the meeting.

Glyphosate

Melissa Gough of Protect Sudbury, spoke to the PWC about the prospect of Eversource using glyphosate, an herbicide suspected of being carcinogenic. The utility is proposing to build an electric transmission line along the defunct MBTA railway, which would require clear-cutting swaths of trees and vegetation, hence the use of glyphosate.

Protect Sudbury is looking into creating a bylaw to address the use of glyphosate in the town. The PWC will support and receive updates by the group. Protect Sudbury is planning a summer and early fall education campaign to inform the town.

Filming the harvester

Diane Muffitt met with Debbie Dineen, Conservation Commission Coordinator, and Debbie made several suggestions of how the PWC can be helpful to the ConCom, for example, working with the commission to do public education videos on Sudbury cable TV. We will suggest that the harvester be filmed at Carding Mill Pond. Harvesting should take place in early to mid-June

Pullathon and Duck Race

The pullathon will be at Stearns Mill Pond on June 17, and the Duck Race will be on June 18, at the Wayside Inn. Diane will get in touch with local Boys and Girl Scout masters to see if any would be interested in participating. First we will need to draw up information on how the scouts need to prepare for the pullathon. Frank will also ask some local farmers if they would like the harvested material, as it is good fertilizer.

Irrigation Bylaws

Anne Slugg stated that irrigation bylaws may be revised to include private wells.
