# I. School Committee Report

#### A. Bill Schedule

### B. Decision on Nixon Plot

Steve Swanger of the Housing Authority was present to discuss options for the parcel of land at the Nixon School to be transferred for housing purposes. Bill Place will be asked to consider another option of keeping the westernmost boundary as east and north as possible and still be able to fit two units, while staying in character with the neighborhood. Committee members will then walk the site again to better understand the new proposed property lines.
