About Mr. Crozier

As the Assistant Superintendent of Wayland Public Schools, Mr. Crozier has been responsible for Curriculum and Instruction K-12 as well as Personnel and Human Resources within the district. He worked with teachers, principals and parents to develop and cultivate many successful endeavors, such as their professional development institutes, STEAM initiatives, and the China Exchange. He emphasizes the strategic use of data and positions to best leverage student learning. This year, in collaboration with the Special Education Department, he helped establish programs at specific grade levels to address historical increases in students with IEPs.

He has played a critical role in the hiring of eight administrators; the creation of the Technology Task force, Full-day Kindergarten pilot, the Wayland Literacy and Math Institutes, Wayland's Professional Learning Communities and district-based learning teams; changes in the curriculum at the Middle School and focused on efforts to launch programs to meet the needs of all learners.

Mr. Crozier received his Bachelors in Business Administration from Graceland College in Iowa and his Masters in Science for Teachers with a focus on Elementary Education from The University of Bridgeport. He completed postgraduate coursework in School Administration from the University of Arkansas as well as the Studies in Education and Policy from Boston College.
