*** IMPORTANT REMINDER ***

Medicare Open Enrollment ends on December 7th!

Every year, Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage (managed care) plans may change their formularies (list of drugs covered), premiums, copays, and deductibles. It's important to review your options EVERY year to make sure you have the plan that works best for you. Some Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage plans are leaving and some new ones are entering. If you are a member of a plan that is leaving, you need to make certain that you have a new plan for January 2013. Changes are allowed until December 7.

If you need assistance with your health or drug insurance plan enrollment, our trained SHINE (Serving Health Information Needs of Elders) volunteers offer free, confidential counseling on all aspects of health insurance to anyone on Medicare. Call the Senior Center to make a SHINE appointment at (978) 443-3055. If we do not have an available appointment, we will refer you to another nearby SHINE location. Additionally, you can call 1-800-AGE-INFO (1-800-243-4636), then press or say 3. Once you get the SHINE answering machine, leave your name and number. A volunteer will call you back as soon as possible. Or call 1-800-MEDICARE, for assistance from a Medicare customer service representative 24 hours/day, 7 days/week.

The general approach is based on Standard American bidding, including strong no trumps, five-card majors, weak two-bids and a strong artificial two-club bid. Certain essential conventions (Stayman, Blackwood, etc.) are included, but emphasis is on general principles and how to develop good judgment, rather than a lot of conventions.

The second session of classes includes: Overcalls and Doubles, Coping with Interference, Weak Two-Bids, Preemptive Bids, Strong Opening Bids and Slam Bidding. Students from the first session receive first priority to take the class, but others are welcome to join in for the second session. Class minimum: 16 students, maximum: 36 students. HAVE YOU HAD THE CONVERSATION?

Why it's important:

- 60% of people say that making sure their family is not burdened by tough decisions is "extremely important"
- 56% have not communicated their end-of-life wishes

One conversation can make all of the difference.

The Conversation Project is a guide dedicated to helping people talk about their wishes for end-of-life care. There is not a single conversation that can cover all the decisions that you and your family may face. What a conversation can provide is a shared understanding of what matters most to you and your loved ones. This can make it easier to make decisions when the time comes.

In that spirit, Ellen Goodman created a Starter Kit. It doesn't answer every question, but it can help you get your thoughts together, and then have the conversation with your loved ones.

You can use this kit, whether you are getting ready to tell someone else what you want, or you want to help someone else get ready to share their wishes.

A few of the questions contained in the kit are as follows:

- How long do you want to receive medical care?
- How involved do you want your loved ones to be?
- What role do you want your loved ones to play? Do you think that your loved ones know what you want or do you think they have no idea?
- What do you feel are the three most important things that you want your friends, family and/or doctors to understand about your wishes for end-of-life care?

SERVICES OFFERED BY THE SUDBURY SENIOR CENTER

In addition to our many educational and recreational programs, we offer a variety of services to provide assistance to older adults in their homes and at the Senior Center. For information about any of the services described below, call the Sudbury Senior Center at 978-443-3055 (unless otherwise indicated).

TRANSPORTATION

Van Transportation: This door-todoor, handicapped accessible service is available Monday through Friday from 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM. On the last Monday of the month we provide transportation to a shopping location outside of Sudbury. Call the Senior Center by 3:00 PM to schedule a ride for the *next* day. The van travels within Sudbury and to some destinations close to Sudbury's borders. The cost for intown trips is \$1.00 each way, and \$2 each way for our out-of-town trips at the end of each month.

F.I.S.H. (Friends in Service Helping): Volunteers drive clients to medical appointments. Call **978-443-2145** one week in advance to schedule a ride. Leave your request on the answering machine, and the coordinator will return your call.

HEALTH SERVICES

Blood Pressure Clinic: The Senior Center, in conjunction with the Board of Health and Parmenter Health Services, offers weekly free drop-in health clinics. Clinic hours are Tuesdays 8:00-9:00 AM and noon to 1:00 PM. Free blood sugar testing is also provided each Tuesday from 8:00-9:00. No appointment is necessary.

Medical Equipment Loan Closet:

For those in need of medical equipment such as shower chairs, walkers, canes, commodes, transfer benches and wheelchairs, the Senior Center may provide the item on loan for as long as it is needed, at **no cost**. We welcome donations of equipment.

IN-HOME SERVICES

In-Home Fix-It Program: Seniors who can no longer (or should not) do small repair tasks at home can get free volunteer assistance with these small jobs. Seniors will only be expected to pay for necessary parts and materials.

Friendly Visitor Program: Seniors who can't get out to socialize can be matched with a volunteer for weekly informal visits.

Grocery Shopping: Volunteer shoppers will make weekly visits to the store, and assist seniors in putting away the groceries. Seniors pay only for the food.

Books on Wheels: This is a pick-up and delivery service for books, DVDs, and audiobooks from the Goodnow Library for those who can't get out.

Lock Boxes: The Senior Center can install lock boxes for Sudbury seniors. These are small safes containing a key to the house, accessible only by the Fire Department. A donation of \$65 is requested to cover the cost of the lockbox, but can be waived for those who cannot afford the cost.

Meals on Site: A full lunch is served at the Senior Center on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at noon. Please call to make a reservation for either day by 11:00 AM on Monday. A voluntary donation of \$3.00 a meal is requested. Menus can be found each month in the Sudbury Senior Scene or posted on the Town website.

Home Delivered Meals: A hot midday meal can be delivered to seniors who can't get out. The drivers also check on the well-being of the senior recipient. A voluntary donation of \$3.00 a meal is suggested. Please call BayPath Elder Services at (508) 573-7200 to ask about starting service.
