Flu clinics sponsored by the Sudbury Board of Health will be held at the Sudbury Senior Center in November.

The shots are for Sudbury residents **aged 65 and older** or who have a chronic medical condition. Pneumococcal immunization shots will be available during the clinic for those with a doctor's order.

Please note: Bring with you your Medicare and your HMO health insurance card (if you have one).

Sudbury Community Work Program

Get help with your property taxes! If you are age 60 or older, and are a Sudbury resident living in your own home, and are willing to commit 100 hours of service to Sudbury in 2008, you may qualify for this program.

Participants earn \$750 toward their 2009 property taxes by serving in a variety of jobs that support Town departments. Every attempt is made to make the skills and interests of applicants mesh with the needs of Town departments.

Applications are available at the Senior Center, 40 Fairbank Road. Funding is available this year for about 50 positions. First round interviews will be held during November, and final interviews will be made with department heads, who will make the final choice of applicants.

Although many participants fill the same job year after year, there is no guarantee that you will receive the same assignment each year. All qualities being equal, preference is given to those in greatest financial need.

The program begins January 1, 2008. Applications are due to the Senior Center no later than **November 15.**

The federally funded fuel assistance program provides a benefit to income eligible persons who need help paying for heat. The application requires documentation of income and other information. For a person living alone, the maximum income to be eligible is \$19,140, for two persons living together, the income maximum is \$25,660. The maximum income level increases for larger families. Getting There from Here

When you can't drive and you live in Sudbury, getting around can be a challenge.

The Senior Center operates a wheelchair lift-equipped van, but service is only available 35 hours a week, and sometimes the demand for this service is so great that not everyone can get a ride when they need one.

That's why the Senior Center is offering a subsidized taxi service for residents age 60 and older and for people with disabilities.

Working with two local cab companies, Natick Cab and Tommy's Taxi, the Senior Center has made arrangements for cab service seven days a week, and from as early as 5:00 in the morning to as late as 1:00 AM.

To use the system, you must purchase a coupon book at the Senior Center. Books cost \$12.50, and are good for \$25.00 worth of taxi rides. Then you call the taxi company directly and schedule your ride. You can pay for the ride with coupons as if they were \$5.00 bills. Of course, any gratuity to the driver must be paid in cash, and you can't cash in your coupons or get "change" for using part of a coupon.

Where can you go? You can travel within Sudbury, and to any town that touches Sudbury, including Acton, Concord, Framingham, Hudson, Lincoln, Marlboro, Maynard, Natick, Stow, and Wayland. You can use the coupons to get to the Logan Express and to the commuter rail stations to get you to Boston.

The program is called Sudbury Senior Access, and is subsidized by the Town in recognition of the fact that seniors and people with disabilities have few other options when it comes to transportation. For more information, call the Senior Center at 978-443-3055.

In this Irish film set in 1920, "Black and Tan" squads are being shipped from Britain to block Ireland's bid for independence. Young men from across Ireland unite to combat these ruthless enemies. 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Medicare Annual Open Enrollment November 15 – December 31

1) Medicare Prescription Drug Plans (Part D Plans) will be open for enrollment between November 15 and December 31, effective January 2008. If you don't have prescription drug coverage, you can join a plan during this time (a penalty may apply). If you have limited income and assets, there is federal assistance to help pay for your Medicare Part D costs.

If you currently have prescription drug coverage, you can change plans at this time. In October, you should have received information about any changes to your plan for next year. The plan you have now may not be the best plan for you in 2008.

- 2) Prescription Advantage, the state prescription assistance program, is currently open for enrollment. This program helps pay your Part D plan (or other "creditable" drug plan) costs. If you join Prescription Advantage, there is no monthly premium and based upon your income, you can save money on your Part D premium, deductible and co-payments. For most people, it also provides coverage in the so-called "donut hole", the gap in coverage that begins once you reach a specified expense.
- 3) Medicare Advantage Plans will be open for enrollment between November 15 and December 31, effective January 2008. Many Medicare Advantage Plans are also changing in 2008. Your plan should have notified you in October of any changes for next year. If you have been satisfied with your plan and it is not changing significantly, you may want to keep it. However, if you have been unhappy or your plan is changing in a major way, you may want to consider all your options.

SERVICES OFFERED BY THE SUDBURY SENIOR CENTER

In addition to our many educational and recreational programs, we offer a variety of services to provide assistance to older adults in their homes and at the Senior Center. For information about any of the services described below, call the Sudbury Senior Center at 978-443-3055 (unless otherwise indicated).

TRANSPORTATION

Van Transportation: This door-to-door, handicapped accessible service is available Tuesday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 3 PM within Sudbury. On Mondays we provide transportation for shopping at a location outside of Sudbury. Please call the Senior Center by 9 AM to schedule a ride for that day. The cost for in-town trips is \$1.00 each way, and \$4 (total) for out-of-town trips.

F.I.S.H. (Friends in Service Helping): Volunteers drive clients to medical appointments. Call 978-443-2145 one week in advance. Leave your request on the answering machine, and the coordinator will call you.

Sudbury Senior Access:

Subsidized taxi rides from Sudbury to any contiguous town. Books of coupons worth \$25.00 in rides are for sale for \$12.50 at the Senior Center. Rides are available 5:30-AM to 10 PM weekdays and 5:30 AM to 5:30 PM on weekends.

HEALTH SERVICES

Blood Pressure Clinic: The Senior Center, in conjunction with the Board of Health and Parmenter Health Services, offers weekly free drop-in health clinics. Clinic hours are Tuesdays 9:00-9:30 and 11:30 to 1:00. Free blood

sugar testing is provided on the **third Tuesday** of each month **8:00-9:00**. No appointment is necessary.

Medical Equipment Loan Closet:

For those in need of medical equipment, the Senior Center may provide the item on loan. We welcome donations of equipment that is no longer needed.

COUNSELING

Information and Referral: Debra

Galloway, our I&R Specialist, provides information about resources and services for older adults and their families in Sudbury. She can provide referrals for home care services, assisted living and nursing home facilities, support groups, adult day health services and more. She is at the Senior Center Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9:30 to 2:30.

Legal Clinic: Denise Yurkofsky, an elder law attorney, is available for free private 20-minute consultations with seniors monthly. Call the Senior Center to make an appointment.

S.H.I.N.E. (Serving the Health Information Needs of Elders): Free consultations about your health insurance concerns, including coverage questions, difficulty with claims, and the changes in Medicare, Thursdays 9-12. Please call to make a free appointment.

IN-HOME SERVICES

Friendly Visitor Program: Seniors who can't get out to socialize are matched with a volunteer for weekly informal visits.

In-Home Fix-It Program: Seniors who can no longer (or should not) do small repair tasks at home can get free volunteer assistance with small jobs around the house. Seniors will only be expected to pay for necessary parts and materials.

Grocery Shopping: A volunteer shopper will make weekly visits to the store, and assist the senior in putting away the groceries. Seniors pay only for the food.

Books on Wheels: This is a pick up and delivery service for books, DVDs, and audiobooks from the Goodnow Library for seniors and people with disabilities who can't get out.

Lock Boxes: The Senior Center can supply lock boxes at no cost to Sudbury seniors. These are small safes containing a key to the house. Volunteers install the boxes at **no charge**. A donation of \$60 may be given to purchase a lock box for a senior who cannot afford one.

NUTRITION
