- O To surrender a dog, please fill out the <u>dog surrender form</u>. Please submit a photo of the dog you wish to surrender. You'll be contacted when they have space. Surrenders are made by appointment only. The surrender fee for an altered dog is \$100; unaltered is \$150.
- O To surrender a cat, call the shelter and ask if there is room available for a surrendered cat(s). If room is available, we can accept your cat that day and ask that you fill out the <u>Cat Surrender Application and Contract</u>. Mail it to the shelter, fax it to **508-852-1868** or email it to <u>Melanie@worcesterarl.org</u>. If there are no open cages, we cannot accept the cat at this time and request you call every day until we have the room. Surrenders are made by appointment only. The surrender fee for an altered cat is \$50; unaltered is \$100.
