We are thrilled to report that the 2026 Camp season has been another “Summer as it should be.” Over the course of our 8 weeks of Camp this summer, we have helped create screen-free life long memories and friendships for hundreds of children and young adults, including 503 Sudbury campers, 93 Sudbury staff, and 49 Sudbury Resident Scholarship Campers.



We also hosted 5 wonderful warm weekend days of Resident swim. We were lucky to have beautiful weather, with no precipitation, each of those days. Once again, the Fourth of July weekend proved to be the most popular time to visit the pond, with 35-47 swimmers joining us each of the three days. The weekend of August 1-2 was a little slower, with 29 swimmers on Saturday and 22 on Sunday.

As summer winds down, we turn our attention to planning for the fall. The Sudbury Parks and Recreation Department is joining in the planning of this year’s Fall Festival, and we are thrilled to be working together to coordinate and advertise the event.
