In light of the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak, Governor Baker issued an emergency Order on March 12, 2020, allowing public bodies greater flexibility in utilizing technology in the conduct of meetings under Open Meeting Law. The Town of Sudbury greatly values the participation of its citizens in the public meeting process, but given the current circumstances and recommendations at the local, state and federal levels to limit or avoid public gatherings, including Governor Baker's ban on gatherings of more than 10 people, together with the present closure of Sudbury public buildings to the public, the Town has decided to implement the "remote participation" procedures allowed under Governor Baker's emergency Order.
