Related Collections

Biographical Note

George Hunt Barton was born on the 8th of July, 1852 in Sudbury, Massachusetts to George W Barton (1824-1894) and Mary Susan (Hunt) Barton (1828-1863). He was very studious in his youth and dedicated to journaling daily. He went on to study geology at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), where he would earn his Bachelor's Degree in 1880.

After graduation, Barton worked for the Hawaiian Government Survey in Honolulu for two years from 1881-1883. When he returned to Boston, he joined the faculty at MIT and became the local authority on glacial landscapes. He explored the Middlesex and Norfolk counties where he was one of the first researchers to recognize New England landscapes as a result from ancient glaciation.

George H Barton married Eva May Beede (1855-1933) in the fall of 1884, and they had three children together: Harold Beede Barton (1887-1887), Donald Clinton Barton (1889-1939), and Helen Mary Barton (1891-1973).

In 1896, Barton joined Robert E. Peary on his last Greenland expedition. He also worked to collect rocks and minerals to sell to institutions for educational purposes while on his tours. These years were fundamental in shaping his interest in the education of science teachers. In 1904 he became the director of the Teacher's School of Science, and worked to establish the Boston Children's Museum in 1909 where he became the founding president. For his accomplishments in glacial geology and science education for teachers, he was made a Fellow for the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 1916.

George H Barton remained a lecturer at MIT and Boston University for many years. On the 25th of November, 1933 during one of his geology classes, Barton collapsed due to a fatal heart attack.

Scope and Content

The George H Barton Collection chronicles the years of a thorough writer, explorer, and collector. The bulk of the collection pertains to Barton's personal life, containing a number of diaries and journals that Barton maintained throughout his life. He also collected autographs, thoughts, and photos of friends,

family and colleagues that give us a glimpse into the more private moments of George H Barton. There are items from other family members that detail information about the Barton and Hunt genealogy, including family bibles and Barton's own handwritten autobiography.

Barton's diaries and journals also shine a light on the activities of his scholarly work and, more importantly, his various adventures and explorations. There is also an extensive amount of rocks and minerals that Barton collected specifically for Goodnow Library. Also included in the collection are artifacts he kept from different tours, including a seal skin suit and bag, a kayak and textiles, along with different publications he and his colleagues published for educational purposes.
