The Town is currently developing a Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness project as part of a grant from the Commonwealth. Included in this process was a survey that flagged transportation as an inequity within Town and a potential area of vulnerability for certain populations. To that end the MVP Core Team is developing a few public outreach opportunities and will include a "station" at these that provide opportunities for folks to respond to questions about their transportation habits. The questions below are the first draft and I volunteered to bring these to the Transportation Committee for input. The next Core Team meeting is likely to be the 2nd week of September so there is not a significant rush on responding, although it would be best if we could provide any comments by the 6 September meeting at the latest.

From our survey, we learned that many Sudbury residents are interested in getting around without a car. We'd like to learn more about your experiences and preferences so we can make this option more accessible to you:

- What types of transportation do you use on a regular basis? Prompt: drive, walk, bike, drive, shuttle, carpool, Catch Connect
- What specific routes or destinations in town would you like to be able to access more easily without a car?
- How often and when if at all do you walk, bike, or roll? By "rolling" we refer to other types of
 personal wheeled mobility besides bicycling, such as wheelchairs, walkers, scooters, mopeds,
 skateboards, and more.
 - o If you do currently, what places do you currently walk, bike, or roll to and for what purpose (e.g. exercise, getting to work, errands)?
 - Are you a member of a walking or biking group?
 - o If you don't currently, what are the main reasons?
 - What would encourage you to walk, bike, or roll more often? Prompt: better sidewalks, bike lanes, lighting, benches, etc.
- How familiar are you with the off-street trails in and around Sudbury?
 - What improvements, connections, or amenities would encourage you to use the current and future trails more?
