Open Space & Recreation

What is open space?

 - Public access to nature (e.g. walking trails)
 - Protecting water quality
 - Protecting habitat (e.g. wetlands, threatened species)



What is recreation?

- □ Indoor and outdoor facilities
 - Playgrounds
 - Parks
 - Multi-use fields
 - Courts
 - Ball fields
