Minutes for Wednesday, December 10, 2025

Radha noted the Open Meeting Laws with respect to hybrid meetings and that the meeting was being recorded.

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 PM

Opening remarks. Radha reported on the meeting with the Sudbury Chamber of Commerce he had just left. The Chamber thanked the committee for their great work.

There was no public comment

Andrea Roessler, Vice President of the Sudbury Historical Society, attended the meeting in person.

Member reports

Radha reported he sent an invitation to attend Sudbury Day, May 16th, 2026, to Sudbury Park & Recreation.

He showed a map layout for Sudbury Day. He discussed connecting to AC power and how the 16' chain link fence would denote the 15' wide vendor booths along the fence. Parking for the vendors would be in the bus parking lot. The space would open at 7:30 AM with set-up complete by 9:30 AM. At 10:00 AM the event will be open to the public

The Flynn building parking lot was suggested for handicapped parking. Canon firing will be at the 9/11 Memorial Park area.

Attendee drop-off for buses and private vehicles will be on the no-name road in front of the Town Hall connecting Route 27 to Concord Road. Also, he discussed public parking at the Methodist Church and the 29 Business Parking lot. Requests will be sent to the appropriate people requesting access. Radha reported the committee sold \$300 of Sudbury 250 gear at the Holiday Fair at the Fairbank Center.

Most of the discussion centered on the times for each of the events on Sudbury Day. The committee discussed possible events at the buildings in the town center between 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

Colonial Living History events would be at the Heritage Park such as the Sudbury Militia & Minute drills and Fyfe & Drum playing. The venue for colonial dancing was discussed possibly occurring at

the Meeting House or Town Hall perhaps 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM. More to be discussed at the next meeting.

The possibility of L/S students receiving Community Service Credit for helping at the event was suggested. Joshua will check into it. Their potential role in supervising some games was mentioned.

Use of the triangular piece of land in front of the Town Hall was discussed. Possibilities include a colonial static display of colonial tents or a demonstration event.

Jan said he would distribute the tentative timetable arrived at by the committee.

Radha showed current expenses to date incurred by the committee.

March 15th was set as the date for Tony Howes presentation about the colonial militia companies. The venue was TBD but at 4:00 PM.

February 15th was discussed as a possible date for Brian Plum's presentation about the Wayside Inn. Possible venues include First Parish Church or the Fairbanks Senior Center.

Next meeting's agenda will include possible children's activities.

Radha said he will be preparing a Quarterly Report along with an Annual Report to the Select Board.

The next two meetings will be on the 7th and 21st of January.
